

Journal of the Whaling Brig Eunice

Wednesday 17th continued

Lat 32.30
Long 75.00
Southwest increasing to a gale saw two Barges and a Brig steering in to the northeast Run to the westward untill 11 P.M. then hove too

Thursday 18th

Lat 31.54
Long 74.40
The wind moderated at 2 P.M. to a light breeze and continued so the rest of the day saw a small Scho steering in to the southward also a steamer going the opposite way

Friday 19th

Lat 30.46
Long 74.64
These twenty four hours fine weather and clear sky with the wind from the westward Tack ship at 1 P.M. standing to the northward Broke out the hole for water and a few other things. One of the crew laid up with venereal disease

Saturday 20th

Lat 30.45
Long 74.17
Calms and very light winds these twenty four hours saw two three masted Schooners steering in to the south west also a steamer going to the northward

Sunday 21st

Lat 31.18
Long 73.00
Fine weather and a clear sky with a light wind from the southwest Run to the northeast all the day with all sail. Saw a steamer steering in to the southward this ends the day

Monday 22nd

Lat 32.10
Long 71.55
This day fine weather and clear sky with a little more wind than yesterday Run to the northeast the whole day with all sail

Lat 32.28
Long 69.00
Fine weather these twenty four hours and a clear sky. Carried all sail heading for Bermuda to send letters home. Saw a ship steering to the northeast Course east, and the wind south

Wednesday 24th

Lat 32.15
Long 67.13
Light wind from the south south west all this day with fine weather and a clear sky. Saw a schooner steering in to the north west Course east south east

Thursday 25th

Lat 32.15
Long 66.10
Calms and light winds these twenty four hours. Crew employed scraping mast and working on rigging.

Friday 26th

Lat 32.14
Long 65.13
Light wind from the westward all this day. Had all sail untill 4 P.M. then took in mainsail fore top gallant sail and flying jib. By observation Bermuda bears east by south distance nineteen miles. Chronometer in error. Broke out for water and shook three small casks

Saturday 27th

Lat 32.07
Long 65.06
Fine weather with a light southwesterly wind these twenty four hours. At 6.30 P.M. lowered starboard boat and ^{cast} went on board the Italian Barge Michele ^{and} to ^{send} letters home. At 2.30 P.M. saw Gibbs light on the southwest end of Bermuda bearing east. Found the Chronometer to be in error three minutes slow from Greenwich

Sunday 28th

These twenty four hours fine weather with a light wind from the south south west. Passed
