

Journal of the Brig Eunice H. Adams

Lat Sunday May 28th 1892 continued
32° 10' St David light at 8 A.M. also spoke a Pilot boat
Long 63° 41' from St Georges. Then kept off east by south bound
for the Western Ground. At 6 P.M. passed a
three masted Schooner steering in to the Northwest
this ends the day

Monday 29th

Lat Light southwesterly wind untill 11 A.M. then
32° 00' it came up a squall which increased at 12
Long 61° 20' a strong breeze and it continued that way
the rest of the day

Tuesday 30th

Lat A fresh breeze from the southwest all this
31° 37' day. Took in the gaff topsail and fore topgallant
Long 58° 55' sail at 11 P.M. but set them again at 10 A.M.
Saw a Barge steering in to the northeast

Wednesday 31st

Lat Fine weather these twenty four hours
31° 30' At 8 A.M. the wind commence to haul to
Long 54° 39' the eastward untill it got to southeast and
continued from that direction the balance
of the day. Broke out the hole for bread

Thursday June 1st 1893

Lat This day fine weather and a clear
32° 65' sky with a light wind from the southeast
Long 65° 00' Saw a Barge steering in to the northeast
and eastward. This ends the day.

Friday 2nd

Lat Light wind from the westward these twenty four
hours. At 8 A.M. saw two large whales lowered both
boats the Capt and Mate went together leaving the
other boat to follow in charge of the two boatmen

Friday June 2nd continued
Struck one of them at 12 A.M. but did get along side
untill 4 P.M. No observation

Saturday 3rd

Lat Started at 4 P.M. to get up the cutting gear
32° 46' and at 7 P.M. commence to cut but did not finish
Long 54° 03' cutting at 7 P.M. then all hands knock off for
supper and did not cut any more that night
Saw another large whale but did lower the
boats as we had all we could attend too
Wind northwest with a moderate breeze. Weather
equally from 6 A.M. untill 9 A.M. then clear the
balance of the day

Sunday 4th

Lat Commence again at 4 A.M. to cut, got off
32° 36' the head and rolled in the body and
Long 64° 26' at 12 A.M. started the tryworks. Saw also a
another large whale but did not lower the
boats. Wind southeast with fine weather

Monday 5th

Lat At 7 A.M. hook on to the case to sail at
32° 13' 4" out and finished at 2 P.M. at 4 P.M. took
Long 64° 37' in the junk. Wind south with fine weather
and clear sky

Tuesday 6th

Lat Continued boiling all day. Moses came on
32° 15' 0" duty today. The weather fine and the wind
Long 64° 05' southwest. The crew cutting up the blubber and
storing some of the oil

Wednesday 7th

Lat Light easterly wind and fine weather these
32° 15' 4" twenty four hours. Boiling all the day
Long 54° 11' 34"
