 The Thursday June 8th 1893

Lat 33.09
 Long 64.41
 This day fine weather and a southerly wind with a few light squalls. Finish looking at 8 P.M. then took in the mainsail and set the try sail.

Friday 9th



Lat 32.58
 Long 64.25
 Fine weather all this day. All hands stowing down the oil and cleaning up. At twelve P.M. saw a large school of small whales bowred the boats and the starboard boat got one. The boat had one missed.

Saturday 10th

Lat 32.38
 Long 64.13
 Put up the cutting gear and commenced to cut at 8 A.M. and at 10 P.M. finished. At 8 P.M. started to boil out the blubber. Weather fine with a clear sky and a light breeze from the northward. Put Thomas Evans in iron for stealing in the cabin.

Sunday 11th

Lat 32.33
 Long 64.27
 Finished trying out at 4 P.M. and wash off the decks. Wind light with a heavy swell. At twelve P.M. took in the mainsail and set try sail. Wind north east. Spoke King Harry Louisa from New York for Barbados.

Monday 12th

Lat 32.55
 Long 64.26
 Stowing down the oil and cleaning ship all this day. Squally in the morning with a light rain but cleared off at 11 A.M. then fine weather the balance of the day.

Tuesday 13th

Lat 33.30
 Long 64.08
 Fine weather and clear sky all this day. Wind light from the southeast. Took Thomas Evans out of iron and gave him a work up job. This ends the day.

 Wednesday June 14th 1893

Lat 32.48
 Long 64.02
 Light southerly wind and fine weather these twenty four hours. Saw a humpback with a small calf going to the northeast. Stood to the south west all the day.

Lat 32.55

Thursday 15th

Long 63.54
 Fine weather with a light southeast wind these twenty four hours. The crew setting up head gear and back stays and doing other jobs.

Lat 33.23

Friday 16th

Long 63.15
 Light southwest wind these twenty four hours with a few light squalls of rain in the morning but clear the balance of the day. Run to the eastward from 8 A.M. until 7 P.M. then huff to the wind under short sail.

Saturday 17th

Lat 33.02
 Long 62.57
 A light breeze all this day from the westward. Stood to the southward until 12 P.M. then tack ship standing to the northward. At 4 P.M. lowered starboard boat and juck up a stack of hard pine timber and took it in on deck for fire wood.

Sunday 18th

Lat 32.25
 Long 62.27
 Fine weather with a light breeze from the west north west these twenty four hours also with a few light squalls from 2 P.M. to 6 P.M.

Monday 19th

Lat 31.30
 Long 61.16
 Light wind from the westward and clear sky until 10 P.M. then it became squally with the wind increasing to a gale and continued so the rest of the day.
