 Sunday July 28th 1893

A moderate breeze from the southward these twenty four hours. At 6 A.M. saw a school of whales going to the northeast. Lowered the boat at 7 A.M. and struck one. Took it along side and put the gear up and commence to cut but did not finish before dark.

 Finish cutting at 10 A.M. then cut up the blubber in horse pieces and clear away the head. Wind southeast and the weather fine. Saw two ships steering in to the northeast.

 Started the works and commence to bail also pump out three casks of water and cut up the junk. Wind east south east and very moderate. Saw a ship steering in to the northeast.

 Finished trying out and stored down the oil then cleared up the decks. Wind east and the weather fine until 2 P.M. then a few light squalls but afterwards clear again. Saw a barge heading to the northeast.

 Wind northeast and moderate towards the first part of the day but increase at the latter. Saw a ship standing to the northward.
