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Lat 33.12
Long 41.30
in to the Southwest All hands employed setting up the rigging Broke the chain plate to the top gallant back stay and fix it with a piece of chain

Lat 33.05
Long 41.24
Friday 4th
A dead calm these twenty four hours Saw two ships and two Barges steering in to the Southeast Set up some of rigging and broke out in the hole for provisions

Lat 33.36
Long 40.39
Saturday 6th
At 4 A.M. the wind came from the northwest with rain squalls and continued until 4 P.M. when it cleared off. Saw a ship steering in to the Southeast Run to the northward and eastward all the day

Lat 33.49
Long 40.40
Sunday 6th
Wind light from the eastward all the day At 6.55 A.M. saw a school of whales hounded but went alongside and missed The starboard boat struck one in the head and the iron came out came on board at 11 A.M. and hounded again at 1 P.M. and struck killed him and took him alongside 4 P.M. and put the cutting gear up Saw a full rigged Brig steering to the westward

Monday 7th
Commence to cut at 5 A.M. and finished at 8 P.M. with the exception of the head Started the tryworks at 7.00 and had all night Lealm the first part of the day then a light breeze from the westward

Tuesday August 8th 1893
Finished taking in the head and bail the case Wind north west and squally with rain Boiling the whole day

Lat 33.48
Long 40.09
Wednesday 9th
Tinish boiling at 8 P.M. and stowed down the oil and cleared up the decks Wind east south east with frequent rain squalls

Lat 33.05
Long 41.10
Thursday 10th
A fresh breeze from the northeast clear the first part but squally towards the latter

Lat 33.16
Long 39.51
Friday 11th
Calm first part of the day but a light breeze from the northwest towards the latter Saw nothing all day

Lat 33.35
Long 40.07
Saturday 12th
The weather cloudy with a light wind from the west northwest The crew employed cleaning the ship Saw nothing all the day

Lat 34.05
Long 40.05
Sunday 13th
Wind northwest and very light these twenty four hours with one or two squalls Saw three water sprouts one which was very large

Long 40.14
Monday 14th
Calm until 6 P.M. then had a light breeze from the southwest the rest of the day Weather hazy
