Friday Oct. 14th

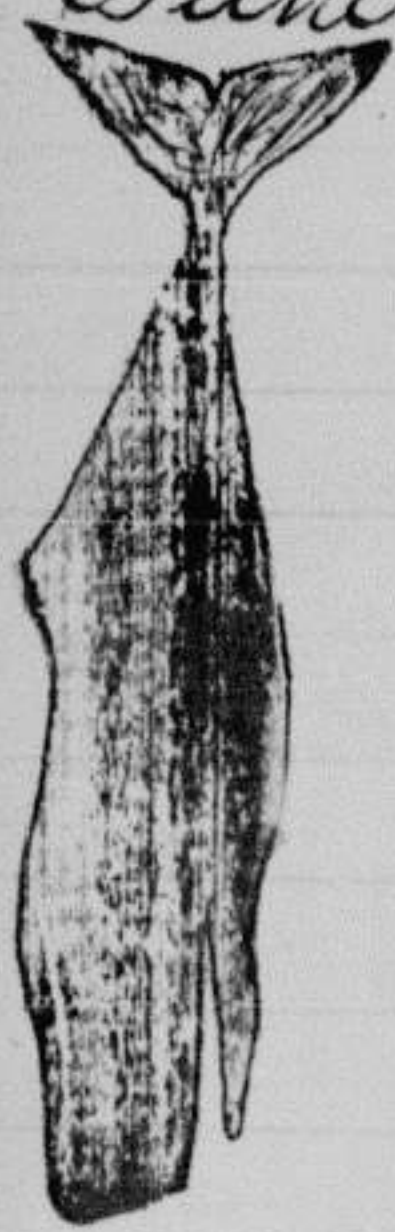
This day moderate weather

This day begins with
moderate breeze from the S.S.W. at 7 A.M.
began to on-board the vessel and at
3 P.M. made sail and started from
St. Michael's.

First part of this twenty four
hours very strong breeze from S. S.W.
vessel steering S. S. E. took in the main-
sail and reefed the top-sail middle part
much rain at 4 P.M. raised a school
of small sperm whales, dropped down
the bows and the L. B. struck and
also S. B. struck and got stove and
iron dunn took the mater whale along
side at 8 P.M. cleared up decks and
set the watches.

This day blowing fresh
from the S.W. vessel hove to under
trysail and foretopmast staysail
with the whale alongside. Saw a
steamer.

This day blowing strong from
S.W. at 9 A.M. wore ship and cut off the whales
head and let the body go and wore around
again on the starboard tack.

and on the port latter part under
easy sail steering by the wind.

heavy rain squalls from S. S.W.
vessel heading to the eastward under
easy sail. tried out the whales head.

Friday Oct. 20th

First part of this day light
breeze from the Southward at 10 A.M.
the steamer Vega crossed our stern bound
to the eastward middle and latter parts
of day calm repaired the starboard boat
and broke out the slop chest.

Saturday Oct. 21st

This day moderate weather
wind from the eastward during first
part made all sail at 7 A.M. hands
employed in getting whaling gear in
order latter part wind from N. E.
vessel steering S. S. E. Saw several sails

This day fresh breeze from the
Lat. 37-15 eastward vessel by the wind on port tack
Long 19-50 under easy sail wore around at 5.30 P.M.
