First and middle parts of this day fresh trades vessel by the wind on port tack at daylight raised St. Antone ahead latter part of the day equally tacked ship and stood off shore under easy sail saw a whaling schr. standing into the S. E.

This day very strong trades at 1 A. M. wore shift and stood by the wind on port tack wore back again at 4 P. M. found the jib-boom split put a lashing around it

This day blowing from N. E. vessel hove too under storm sails on the starboard tack

This day moderate trades vessel by the wind on starboard tack broke out beef, pork, bread and molasses

Monday Dec. 25th

This day fresh trades took in the mainsail top gallant sail flour. and flying jib at 1 A. M. vessel on the port tack latter part of day broke out flour.

Tuesday Dec. 26th

This day fresh trades vessel by the wind on the port tack Bread at 5 P. M. reefed the main sail and set it. broke out bread saw blackfish

Lat. 18-45
Long. 27-05

Wednesday Dec. 27th

This day fresh trades vessel by the wind on the port tack untill 5.30 P. M. then tacked and stood off shore saw St. Antone in the afternoon
