Thursday Dec. 28th

This day moderate trades vessel working tacks to windward weather very smoky at dark vessel standing by the wind on the starboard tack.

This day began with light trades made all sail at 3 A. M. vessel standing into the S. E. middle and latter parts of the day fresh trades at 5 P. M. reefed the main sail and took in top gallant flying jib and top mast stay sail vessel standing on off shore tack saw a schooner to leeward beating up. No Obs.

Saturday Dec. 30th

This day moderate trades and smoky vessel by the wind on port tack first part of the day and on starboard tack latter part saw a schooner to leeward crew employed setting up fore rigging.

This day moderate breeze from S. S. E. made all sail at daylight and stood along by the wind on the starboard tack saw two finbacks and porpoises.

This day blowing from S. W. vessel lay to on the port tack under storm sail at 5 P. M. wore ship.
