Saturday Jan. 6th

These twenty four hours fresh breeze from the eastward run into the S.W. until noon then hauled up by the wind on port tack and wore ship at 5.30 P.M. and lay into the northward under easy sail saw a schooner and a steamer.

Sunday Jan. 7th



This day fresh breeze from the eastward vessel by the wind on the starboard tack at 9.45 capt. raised a small spout close to the vessels wake at 10 A.M. mate raised more spouts on the lee bow coming quick to windward lowered the boats but did not succeed in striking. Lat. 19.13

Monday Jan. 8th

This day moderate breeze and cloudy wind from East vessel by the wind on port tack saw porpoises.

Tuesday Jan. 9th

This day moderate breeze from the eastward vessel cruising saw porpoises and a large white water just before sunset.

Wednesday Jan. 10th

This day fresh breeze from E.N.E. made sail at day light and stood to the northward all day saw porpoises and a steamer shortened sail at sunset.

Thursday Jan. 11th

This day strong breeze from the E.N.E. vessel standing to the northward under comfortable sail until 5 P.M. then tack and shortened sail at sunset on the port tack saw two vessels and two white waters. so ends.

Friday Jan. 12th

This day fresh breeze from E.N.E. made sail at day light on the port tack and stood to the S.E. all day took in the main sail and flying jib at sunset saw a whaling schooner.

Saturday Jan. 13th

This day fresh trades and very smoky vessel on the port tack under easy sail at sunset took in the foresail and jib.
