

Remarks Aboard Brig C. M. Adams

Sunday Jan. 14th

1800 of day
This day strong trades from N.E. and very thick vessel standing to the S.E. all day and at sun set wore ship and took in the foresail and gib. heading to the northward. Lat. 17-30 Long 22-32

Monday Jan. 15th

Broad
This day very strong trades vessel standing to the northward untill 5.30 P.M. then wore around and stood in to the S.E. under short sail. Lat. 18.00 Long. 23.00

Tuesday Jan 16th

This day blowing fresh vessel hove too all day under reefed topsail and trysail weather very foggy. Lat 17.45 Long 22-58

Wednesday Jan. 17th

This day very strong breeze from E. at 1 A.M. I kept off and ran S. by W. for Isle of Salt ran untill 12 A.M. but as we did not see the Island and the weather being very thick we hauled up on the wind on the starboard tack under easy sail. Lat. 17.00 Long 22-31

This day blowing stiff from the eastward vessel laying on the starboard tack under storm sails throughout the day. Saw blackfish Lat. 18-12 Long 22-52

Friday Jan. 19th

This day fresh breeze Broad foggy and rugged vessel laying on the starboard tack all day saw two steamers broke out broad started a full cask and also started a full bl. of Molasses. Lat. 19.18 Long 23-06

Saturday Jan. 20th

This day strong breeze from East at 7 A.M. wore ship and stood to the southward and eastward all day under easy sail. Lat. 19.10 Long 23-11

Sunday Jan. 21st

This day fresh trades from E. N. E. vessel on the port tack by the wind untill 3.30 P.M. then kept off S.W. by S. for Sal. Lat. 17-48 Long. 22-31

Monday Jan. 22nd

This day fresh breeze and thick ran untill 2 A.M. then came too on the starboard tack on account of the fog. stood to the Northward all day. Lat. 17-24 Long. 23-11
