Tuesday Jan. 23rd.

Thursday Jan. 25th

This day strong trades from the N.E. at 6 A.M. hove up the anchor and went to the town to enter and get some wood took the lighter of wood alongside and unloaded it sent a boat to tow it back ashore but as it could not do it sent the other two could not tow it against the current so took it astern of the vessel and hung to it all night.

Friday Jan 26th

This day very strong trades worked up and came to anchor at 10 A.M. snugged up every thing and gave her 30 fathoms chain.
