

Sunday Feb. 11th 1894

This day moderate breeze from E.N.E. vessel laying off and on until daylight then worked up and came to an anchor at 3 P.M. went aboard of the Hodgson

Monday Feb. 12th

This day strong breeze from the eastward at daylight called all hands and hoisted casks towed them aboard of the schooner and divided the oil towed it aboard and stowed it away also filled some salt water.

Tuesday Feb. 13th

This day fresh trades and smoky finished stowing down and smoky finished stowing down the hold and cleaned the bar-nacles off the vessels bottom as far as they could reach. opened our last cask of bread to-day.

Wednesday Feb. 14th

This day began with moderate trades at 6 A.M. sent the six stowaways ashore in our boat and got under way at 7 A.M. the L. H. Hodgson also found fresh trades outside

Thursday Feb. 15th

This day began with moderate trades at 9 A.M. kept off for St. Vincent the capt. complaining with fever, came to anchor at 8 P.M. and the visit came onboard and two guards.

Friday Feb. 16th

This day moderate trades at 9 A.M. went on shore and done all business and came off again in the afternoon.

Saturday Feb. 17th

This day moderate trades vessel laying at anchor in the harbor of St. Vincent at 6 A.M. called all hands and the fore mast hands would not turn too Capt tried to coax them but could do nothing took six men and the 1st mate and steward before the council and at the last they decided to go on board and turn too Manuel Brown boatswain was discharged by mutual consent and Manuel Alms seaman ran away Antone Forte also. absent over 36 hours. Cleared the Vessel and ready for sea.
