This day moderate breeze from the Northward vessel on the starboard tack first and middle parts of the day and on the port latter part weather very smoky

This day light breeze from the S. N. E. at 7 A.M. made all sail and steered W. by N. at 9 A.M. mate raised a white water on the lea bow ran for it but did not see it. started the course again and at 10 A.M. saw it ahead again but could not see any spouts, hauled the vessel aback and lay for a while then kept off again and at 11.30 saw the spouts close to on the lea bow lowered the boats L. B. struck a good cow and S. B. got a calf took them alongside at 3 P.M. sent up the gear and cut in the calf.

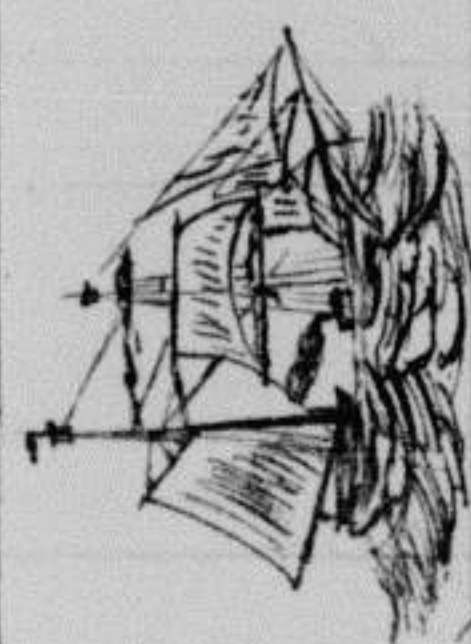

This day we had a light breeze from the N. E. at 4 A.M. the starboard try pot bursted, bailed the oil out quick and finished boiling with one pot repaired the S. B. stowed down one cask. Lat. 17.45

This day we had a light breeze from the N. E. at daylight stowed down the rest of the oil and washed the vessel saw the schr. Chas. H. Hodgdon she had taken a whale last Saturday. Lat. 17.46

These twenty four hours we had a moderate breeze from the N. E. at 8 A.M. set the mainsail and kept off W. S. W. took in the mainsail at sundown. Lat. 17.33
