Saturday 7<sup>th</sup> April This day clear weather the pot was fixed in the works.

Sunday 8<sup>th</sup> April This day clear weather Sailed for Dominica and got there on the tenth.

Wednesday 11<sup>th</sup> April This day clear weather started taking water until the sixteenth and one of the sailors deserted the ship.

Tuesday 17<sup>th</sup> April This day clear weather sailed for St. Eustatius and reached there on the twentieth shipped four seamen and one boat sterner

Sunday 22<sup>nd</sup> April This day clear weather sailed for Hatter's vessel steering N.W. by N. at nine lost sight of Lambarala end this day.

Monday 23<sup>rd</sup> April This day clear weather commenced rigging the waist boat vessel steering N.W. by N. end this day

Tuesday 24<sup>th</sup> April This twenty four hours fine trades vessel steering N.W. by N. broke out one barrel hard bread and two kegs of molasses

Wednesday 25<sup>th</sup> The 1894  
the 26<sup>th</sup> March Commenced with eight Brise from S.E. and with Rain and Briz and all sail Sait allense in ploing in ship duty so end this day latitude 22.23 long.

Thursday 26<sup>th</sup> April This twenty four hours fine trades vessel steering first part of the day N. Later part N.W. by N. end this day made mast for the waist boat and cut the sail and parted the waist boat.

Friday 27<sup>th</sup> April This twenty four hours fine trades vessel steering N.W. broke out two barrels of flour end this day.

Saturday 28<sup>th</sup> April This twenty four hours fine weather vessel steering by the wind heading N.W. A seaman Abraham Donerit the mate went to the fore-castle door and called him and waited a half hour and he would not come sent the boat-steerer to see if he was coming up and he would not answer and the captain went after him and got him up and wanted him to go around the riggings to see if he knew them and he refused and told him then to go to mast head and he refused again. And he was put in irons on bread and water. Broke out the hole for a barrel of beef. End this day.
