Wednesday 23rd May This twenty four hours light breeze and a heavy sea got through trying out seven O'clock in the morning in the afternoon Aleone raised a school of whales lowered and struck two we lowered but never got up to the boats before dark but we mated. ends this day

Thursday 24th May This twenty four hours very strong breeze and rain vessel lying under short sail stowed down the oil the bark Resident, Aleone, is in sight. end this day

Friday 25th May This twenty four hours fine weather vessel cruising round raised a school of whales early in the morning with the Aleone, and bark Resident in sight we lowered and struck three whales killed them and brought them in and cut them in that same day end this day

Saturday 26th May This twenty four hours very rough sea the Aleone lost one of her whales her captain came aboard and told it while we were trying out. we started the work that morning end this day
