

Ship Falcon Ste. Augustine Bay May 1881

Wednesday 9th

Moderate Steering N. E. with all sail set
At day light saw two sail E. and the land
Employed in ship's duty Lat 2° 38' Long 40° 44' East

Wednesday 10th

Moderate Wind and fine weather Steering for the Bay
At day light set sail and headed off shore
At day light three sail and three masted ships were seen
At 10 P.M. a little to the N. E. of Sandy Island in company
with the Harriet at day light 3 000 sperm 400 whale oil

Thursday 11th

Moderate Steering N. E. at day light at West Point 8 00
For the purpose of having some anchorage in 9 fathoms
Brought the boat to anchor bearing East 8 miles East
Found the good harbor headland of S. B. 1500
Many flocks of S. B. 900 White-bellied Gulls. Northern Gulls, say of S. B. 1100
Sailed for port Employed in settling N. E. the natives

Friday 12th

Regular Land and sea breeze Employed in
Whaling took and board 5000 lb of blubber and 1000 lb of oil

Saturday 13th

Moderate Employed in Steering for the harbor getting
back to the shore and getting a bullhead and 1000 lb of oil

Sunday 14th

Moderate All best and weather clear and fine
By 10 o'clock at 10 o'clock set sail in board
Regular Land and sea breeze and Moderate

Monday 15th

Moderate Land and sea breeze Employed in getting
off the shore and so on

Tuesday 16th

Moderate Wind and fine weather Employed in
getting back and water took two bullock on board
And so on

Wednesday 17th

Moderate Employed in getting ready for sea
At 10 P.M. ship Maria came to anchor in the Bay
Lat 3 40 Sperm
At day light set sail and headed off shore
At day light three sail and three masted ships were seen
At 10 P.M. a little to the N. E. of Sandy Island in company
with the Harriet at day light 3 000 sperm 400 whale oil

Thursday May 18th

Moderate at 10 P.M. saw Spanish Whales going
N. E. quick and far. Did not gain but little
At day light three sail and three masted ships were seen
At 10 P.M. a little to the N. E. of Sandy Island in company
with the Harriet at day light 3 000 sperm 400 whale oil

Moderate Wind and fine weather Steering for the Bay
At day light set sail and headed off shore
At day light three sail and three masted ships were seen
At 10 P.M. a little to the N. E. of Sandy Island in company
with the Harriet at day light 3 000 sperm 400 whale oil

First part Moderate latter part Moderate
Lat at day light Steering to the N. E. and East
