

Ship Falcon in Lettigo Bay June 1851

Tuesday 20th

Moderate winds and fine weather sent two boats
in shore for whales without success the cooper
setting up blocks and so ends

Wednesday 21st

Moderate winds and fine weather sent two boats
in shore for whales and the hired smack one
whale and took him to the wharf and so ends

Thursday 22nd

Moderate fine weather the boats in shore for whales
but saw nothing the ship keepers employed in
finishing stowing iron and so ends No Ok

Friday 23rd

Moderate winds and fine weather boats in shore for
whales without success the cooper employed in
setting up life blocks and so ends

Saturday 24th

Light winds and fine weather the boats from both
ships in shore for whales without success the
cooper employed in setting up life blocks and so ends

Sunday 25th

Light winds from the eastward both ships boats
in shore for whales without success & ships in sight
and so ends No Ok

Monday 26th

Strong winds and squally at day light steamed
off to the eastward but saw nothing and so
ends No Ok

Tuesday 27th

Strong winds and squally sent in two boats
but saw nothing No Ok

Ship Falcon For Port Macquarie June 1851

Wednesday 28th

Moderate sent in two boats the heavy two boats
hauling to the eastward but saw nothing
at eleven set came on board and steamed
E S E latter sent employed in sending up top
gallant masts and yards and so ends
Lat 24 38 Long 34 42 East

Thursday 29th

Moderate winds at N E Steaming by to the eastward
employed in heaving the old sail and
hauling them aboard so ends Lat 25 12 Long 36 10 East

Friday 30th

Moderate winds and fine weather Steaming by to
the eastward employed in heaving sails
at 9 am saw several small whales hove and
took two to the old Falcon and got lines
and so ends No Ok

Saturday the 1st of July 1851

Moderate winds and fine weather
employed in cutting at eleven set
finished cutting one whale got
supper and began heaving set
the watch at day light began
cutting the other whale at 10 finished and began
heaving the heads and so ends

Sunday 2nd

Strong winds at N E and rugged weather employed
in heaving and clearing the decks and with strong
gales at South Steaming N E E employed in heaving
Lat 24 15 South Long 37 21 East

Monday 3rd

Strong gales at South Steaming N E E employed
in heaving at day light
finished ends moderate employed in cleaning
ship and coopers and so ends

Lat 24 17 South Long 37 30 East
