

Ship Falcon Cruising Oct 1837

Sunday 22nd

Strong winds at West Steering to the North and East
latter part Moderate Saw Spinnaker Whales lowered
and hauled up two and took one to the ship
and made sail for the other one and so ends



Monday 23rd

Moderate at 2 pm to make the last whale to the
ship and began cutting at sunset finished
cutting one whale took in sail got supper set
The Watch and began cutting at day light began
cutting finished at 9 o'clock hauled sail
Saw one whale lowered without success and so ends
Lat 34.19 Long 66.20 East

Tuesday 24th

Moderate Employed in hauling Spike ship
George and Martha of New Bedford 1000 lbs
ends moderate saw nothing more Spike ship
Portland of Newberg 6 Whales and so ends
Lat 34.19 Long 67.20 East

Wednesday 25th

Strong winds at South Steering to the South
Spike ship of New Bedford
900 whale and 500 Spinnaker seen a plenty
of Whales but very little ends with strong
winds at N.W. and rain saw nothing
Employed in hauling today saw and so ends
8th Obs

Thursday 26th

Strong winds at West Steering to the South
Saw Spinnaker of Whales lowered without success
Saw eight Whales lowered and took one to the ship
finished hauling from the Spinnaker oil and so
ends so ends



Friday 27th

Moderate gales at West Steering by the whale
at day light more moderate at 8 o'clock began
cutting at 12 finished and got dinner
Lat 34.44 Long 67.20

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Saturday 28th

Moderate gales at S.W. Employed in hauling
Saw 10 ends Lat 34.31 Long 67.10 East

Sunday 29th

Moderate gales at S.W. Employed in
hauling at 12 finished and cleared the
deck ends more moderate made sail
but saw nothing ships head to the South
Lat 34.10 Long 67.20

Monday 30th

Strong winds at N.W. Steering to the South
ends with strong gales at S.W. ships head to
the South Lat 33.20 Long 67.40

Tuesday 31st

Strong gales at S.W. ships head to the North
Saw ships in sight Employed in hauling
Down latter part a little more moderate
Lat 34.38 South Long 67.20 East

Wednesday Nov 1st 1837

Strong gales at West heading to the North and South
Alternate Employed in hauling bones
and so ends Lat 34.50 Long 67.50 East

Thursday 2nd

Strong winds at N.W. carrying moderate
sail to the North at 12 midnight one ship
to the S.W. saw five boats two ships in sight
Employed in hauling duty latter part strong gales
and so ends Lat 34.09 Long 67.10 East

Friday 3rd

Strong gales at N.W. ships head to the S.W.
Saw three ships in sight heading to the S.W.
ends moderate Employed in hauling off
the fore hold the cooper Employed
in hauling up shacks saw nothing so ends

Saturday 4th

Moderate winds to the Westward with thick
fog and some rain ends with a little
better weather saw Whales lowered
without success and so ends
