Wednesday 14th

Moderate Employed Breaking out oil between Deck
Trunk 200 Cells on Deck. Letter from Strong-Words
with thunder and lightning and rain in the morning
stop the lighter along side. Sheet had not abored to
put any oil in to them.

Thursday. 15th

Strong Winds with Thunder Lightning and Rain
Employed Draining off oil and breaking out
Painting Ship &c. Mr. R. Timerson has set
Came on Board since Sunday last and like wife
& Madison Greene John McHard since Monday
last conclude they intend to leave the Ship.

Friday 16th

1st 2 Am took the lighter along side and
put in about 500 Bbls of oil and took it on shore
2 took on Board 7 Bbls Pork one Beef 5 Bbls flour
4 Bags Bread 80 Gals Molasses one Bbl tin
and 3/4 Cords

Saturday 14th

June Weather Employed Painting and sales
Having the the And stonings of Betracen Books
the volume

Took on Board about 60 Bbls Water
And

Monday 18th

fine weather all hands excepting one boats
crew on shore on Liberty at their wet came off
stranded ship Seine of N Bedford 90 1819

Monday 19th

Delivered one Boat crew on shore at Liberty
Received on board one Boat load of their
Furnace the Stone and Nethering Stone and 4 Ends

Tuesday 20th -

Moderate fine weather. Tides on Bayard about
40 fathoms and during small articles
from the shore and one here

Wednesday 21st

Rademacher employed in Washington, D.C., and
receiving Sunday small articles from
The Office and getting ready for sea.

Mr. George W. Bidder came on board
having agreed with the captain for a passage
to N Bedford

Thursday 22nd

This Light airs and calms at Day Light
 She Short and Waited for the customary visit
 At 8 Am the Officers came on Board
 At 8.30 Am took away anchor and commenced
 Beating out of the harbour at 11 Am etc.
 A boat from the ~~USS~~ US Ship Independence
 Came along side with an officer stating that
 She would go on board of the Brazilian Corvette
 Then Beating out and Demand me of our
 Men Wm A Simerson he having shipped on Board
 Of her her captain requested him to Proceed
 Which he did and brought the Man on Board
 Without further trouble Ends With Moderate
 Breeze and Fine Weather

Friday 23^d

Moderate Winds and Fine Weather Employed
Beating out at 2 Pm came to anchor the tide
having turned at 4 Pm took our anchor
and began beating out at 9.30 came to anchor
again it being calm at 1.30 then
took our anchor and made sail steering S 8
Latter part Light air from the Land Employed
unbending the cables striking the anchors 30
