

Friday July 24th 1846

P.M. brisk breeze and fine weather from S.W. steering by S tacks aboard employed in rigging craft at 4 tried to speke a Brig but did not make it out 7-30 thick fog again kept the Ship away S.E. at 9 A.M. kept E.P.E. light breeze and fine weather from S.W. two Barques in sight and one ship the ship a whaler

Long est 69-04 W

Saturday July 25th P.M. light breezes and fine weather from S westward steering E.P.E. by compass at 1 lowered two Boats for Blackfish but without success at 3 lowered and got one the three above mentioning sails in sight at 4 kept E by S light breeze and cloudy latter the weather much the same

Sat obs 39-59 N 39-55

Sunday July 26th P.M. light breeze and pleasant from the westward all hands employed in ship duty middle and latter fresh breeze flying clouds from W steering E by S took in fore and mizen top g sails

Monday July 27th 1846

P.M. moderate gales and flying clouds from the westward steering E by S at 7 the breeze increased took in main top g sail and double reefed the top sails sum lowry latter 60 M more moderate set whole top sails and fore and main top g sails and baled out the Blackfish blubber

Tuesday July 28th P.M. a fine fresh breeze from the westward steering E by S with all sail set two sails in sight stern the watch employed in Ship Duty latter light breeze and frequent squalls of rain from the westward

Sat obs 39-50 N
Long by Chron 57-16 W

Wednesday July 29th P.M. lowered two Boats for Blackfish and got fast and drew from him light breezes and sum showers of rain from the westward saw a fore top sail Chooer staning N eastward middle part brisk breeze and flying clouds at 7 A.M. set fore top mast studding sail the wind cant to S eastward
