

Thursday Aug 6 1846

P.M. a fine fresh breeze from the S.W. steering S.E. by E. & E. at 4 saw her maplowa Brig steering to the N. westward at 9 took in studding sail and fore and main top & sails at 4-30 set top & sails and studding sail three sails in sight at 7 raised the gale Sand of Flores bearing S.E. by S Dist 20 miles at 7-30 raised Carvo six sails in sight latter running down between Flores and Carvo got becalm and had to tow at 11-30 took abreeze from S.W. San Cruse Dist 6 miles

Friday Aug 7th at 10 P.M. carried away the fly jib boom at 2 tacked in for the harbor at 3 lowered a Boat and went on shore the Ship three Brothers Capt. Michel Chantrel 26 days out clean latter part sun squalls of rain one Boat on shore traidding

Saturday Aug 8th P.M. lying of an on to sande crues at 4 P.M. got of one lanch lode of potatoes and onions had a row on shore with one of the men tied him hand and feet and broat him on board and kept him tide all night at 8 A.M. the other lanch lode came of and i went on shore and saw the council about taking the man on shore and got consent came on board three sails in sight a dead calm

Sunday Aug 9th 1846

at 1 P.M. took Mr. Norman and his things on shore calm and fine weather three sails in sight middle part calm at 6 A.M. light breeze from the westward at 10-30 lowered three Boats for Grampercis and Flores and Graciosa in sight

Monday Aug 10th P.M. light breeze and fine weather from S. westward steering by S tacks aboard two sails sails in sight at 8 A.M. tacked to the S. westward the gale Sand of St. George Foyal in sight latter part brisk breeze and fine weather from the south two sails in sight

Tuesday Aug 11th P.M. fresh breeze from the south steering by S tacks on board one sail in sight the carpenter employed in making a fly jib Boom middle part and latter light breeze and fine weather from S. westward at 11 tacked to the southward

Sat obs 38-25 CR
Long by chron 39-50 W
