

Monday January 18th 1847

P.M. nearly calm at 4 raised a sail to the north 5 light airs from N.E. W. steered by S tacks aboard with all sail set middle steering by on different tacks at 6 A.M. spoke an Obert town Brig capt Roberson 6 weeks out clean latter light airs from N.E. W. steering by S tacks aboard Sat obs 46-33

Tuesday Jan 19th P.M. the breeze falls nearly to a calm at 3 took light breeze and thick fog from S.E. steered N. by W. with all sail set middle part thick lowering weather latter nearly calm

Sat obs 45:47 S
Long by chron 173-14 E

Wednesday Jan 20th P.M. light breeze and cloudy from N.E. W. steering by S tacks aboard with all sail set at 9 tacked to N.E. at 10 the wind came to the eastward kept N.E. W. at 3 A.M. run over a R. whale at 10 the breeze very light and came to north were ship to the eastward latter light breeze and cloudy from N.E.

Thursday January 21st 1847

P.M. light airs and cloudy from N. westward steering by S tacks aboard at 4 saw the land to the westward comes on thick and rainy middle part the wind came to the westward and breeze on fresh steered by S tacks aboard at 8 came to S.W. in a heavy squall double reefed the top sails and kept N.W. Banks Peninsula in sight ahead at 9 moderate set all sail latter light breeze and fine weather from S.E. steering N.W. with all sail set Sat obs 44:42 S

Long by chron 174:08 E

Friday Jan 22nd P.M. light breeze and fine weather from south steering N.W. for with all sail set the peninsula in sight ahead at 2 comes on a heavy gale from south took in fore and mizzen top sails and heaved the dingy to the S.E. under double reefed main top sail and fore sail and close mizzen at 3 A.M. were ship and set whole top sails at daylight at Akroa heads bearing N.W. Dist 15 miles light breeze and cloudy from S eastward steering in for the bay

Saturday Jan 23rd at 3 P.M. came to anchor in five fathoms of water in Akroa bay the Ship Hanabal capt Canning Sagbarbor 16 months out 350 fls of oil and one French Barque lying their light breeze & fine weather
