Saturday May 1<sup>st</sup> 1847

P.M. wore ship to S westward and set chase reefed top sails the weather continues much the same tow the above mention sails in sight tow the leeward at 10 wore ship to Westward at 8 A.M. wore to the south latter more moderate set dit two sails in sight

Sunday May 2<sup>nd</sup> P.M. light breeze and lowry from S.E. set main sail and whole main top sail at 8 wore ship to the Westward at 6 shortened sail at 4 spoke an absent town Brig one mont out clean at 12 wore ship to the south at 8 A.M. wore to the north the wind from E.S.E. latter fresh breeze and cloudy three sails in sight

Monday May 3<sup>rd</sup> P.M. fresh breeze and lowry from E.S.E. steering by S tacks aboard at 3 tacked to S.E. at 5 shortened sail thick fogg at 8 A.M. wore to S.W. at 8 wore to S eastward latter fresh breeze and lowry from N.E. two sails in sight

Tuesday May 4<sup>th</sup> 1847

at 1 P.M. spoke the Ship Peruvian capt Boyer New London 21 monts out 2300 bls of oil had just cut in an 80 bl. whale at 5 shortened sail and wore ship to Westward fresh gales from N.E. at 12 wore ship to Eastward at 8 set all sail latter fresh breeze from S.E. one sail in sight to the leeward

Wednesday May 5<sup>th</sup> P.M. light breeze & cloudy from N.E. steering by S tacks aboard at 5 wore ship to S eastward and shortened sail to wore ship to Westward at 7 set all sail at 9 kept of W.S.W. latter fresh breeze and cloudy from the north 4 sails in sight

Thursday May 6<sup>th</sup> P.M. spoke the Ship Megostick Capt Smith New Bedford cutting a sperm whale at 5 shortened sail at 12 wore to the westward at 8 wore to Eastward latter part fresh breeze from north 5 sails in sight

Friday May 7<sup>th</sup> P.M. the weather continues the same steering by S tacks aboard at 5 shortened sail nearby calm middle part light baffling winds at 6 A.M. thick an rain at 9 letted up set all sail latter part light breeze from S.E. 5 sails in sight
