P.M. set double reefed top sails fresh gale and
a high sea on from the westward at 7 saw a sperm
whale turn flukes middle and latter parts
light airs from S.W. westward steering W.G.W. two
sails in sight. Sat obs 45:01

Friday May 28th P.M. nearly calm at 6
light airs from S. westward Steered by
Stacks aboard at 3 A.M. comes on fresh
gale from S.W. took in fore sail and wore
Ship to S.E. latter the same no obs

Saturday May 29th P.M. the weather
the same at 8 A.M. wore Ship to the
westward and set double reefed top sails
at 10 spoke the Ship Megestick New Bed
Capt. Smith latter fresh gales and squally
from S.S.W. Sat obs 44:25
Song by Chron 174:48

Sunday May 30th P.M. the weather continues
the same steering by Stacks aboard two sails in
sight 3 A.M. took light breeze from S.W. kept
S.W. latter part light breeze and a heavy swell on
one sail in sight Sat obs 44:12
Song by Chron 174:00

Monday May 31st P.M. light breeze and
fine weather from S.W. kept S.W. by S at 5
double reefed the top sails & nearly calm
Banks peninsula bearing W by S Dist 40 miles
at 3 A.M. comes on fresh gale from S.S.W.
took in fore and mizzen top sails
latter the same Sat obs 44:27
Song est 174:30 E

Tuesday June 1st 1847

P.M. the weather the same at 5:30
wore Ship to the westward middle more moderate
set double reefed top sails latter light breeze and
fine weather from the westward steering by Stacks
aboard with all sail set the Banks in sight
Sat obs 44:19 S
Song by Chron 174:31 E

Wednesday June 2nd P.M. light breeze and
fine weather from the westward steering by S
stacks aboard at 4:30 double reefed the top sails
middle and latter parts calm Sat obs 44:43
Song est 174:15

Thursday June 3rd at 4 P.M. took light
breeze from S.E. kept W.G.W. at 5 reefed fore
and mizzen top sails at 12 took in main top G
sail and reefed main top sail latter light
breeze and fine weather from S.E. steering W
with all sail set the Sand in sight to the
westward Sat obs 44:45
Song est 172:40 E

Friday June 4th P.M. kept away S at 4:30
took sail and luffed to to the eastward fresh breeze
from N.N.E. middle blowing fresh gale and
rain at 3 A.M. wore Ship to the westward
latter nearly calm and a heavy swell on the
Sand in sight to the westward Sat obs 45:04
Song est 172:40

Saturday June 5th at 2 P.M. took light breeze
from S.W. westward steered by Stacks aboard at 4:30
double reefed the top sails nearly calm at 2 wore Ship
to S. westward latter light breeze S.E. one sail in
sight and the Sand to the westward Sat obs 45:27
Song by Chron 172:27
