

Sunday June 6<sup>th</sup> 1847

P.M. kept S.E. light breeze from south at 4 nearly calm and foggy at 6 wore ship to the eastward at 8 A.M. wore to south at 9 set all sail light breeze and heavy from E.S.E. steering by S. tacks aboard

Monday June 7<sup>th</sup> P.M. brisk breeze and heavy from E.S.E. steering by S. tacks aboard at 4 shortened sail and wore to S.E. at 2 A.M. wore to north at 9 set double reefed top sails and wore to S. westward one sail in sight latter fresh and heavy from E.S.E.

Tuesday June 8<sup>th</sup> P.M. fresh gale and cloudy from E.S.E. at 5 wore ship to north and took in mizzen top sail at 12 wore to S. eastward at 8 A.M. wore to north latter fresh breeze and cloudy

Wednesday June 9<sup>th</sup> P.M. more moderate set whole top sails and main sail at 4:30 shortened sail and wore to S. eastward at 12 wore to north at 9 kept W.S.W. at 10 kept E.S.E. at 11:30 raised Chub of sperm whales and kept for them fresh breeze from E.S.E.

Thursday June 10<sup>th</sup>

at 1 P.M. lowered and struck a large whale and lost the line chaist him till dark but could not come up with him came on board and double reefed the top sails and wore ship to S. eastward at 2 A.M. wore to north at 8 kept of S.W. at 11:30 raised a sperm whale and called it the same that took the line the night before

Friday June 11<sup>th</sup> 1847

P.M. lowered and chaist but the whale was gone to quick to the windward for us at 2 luffed to S. tacks aboard at 4 shortened sail a Barque in sight to the leeward at 12 wore to north at 10 A.M. kept of W.S.W. fresh breeze from E.S.E.

Saturday June 12<sup>th</sup> P.M. luffed to to S.E. at 11:30 shortened sail at 12 wore ship to S. westward at 7 A.M. set whole top sails fresh breeze from S.E. those sails in sight

Sunday June 13<sup>th</sup> P.M. wore ship to S.E. at 4:30 shortened sail at 10 wore ship to S.W. at 9 kept of W by S at 11 raised sail luffed to to S.W. latter part fresh breeze and heavy

Monday June 14<sup>th</sup> P.M. wore ship and spoke the B. Tucker and the Berckhuytens Capt. Cottle of Gistroy 7 months out 200 bls 100 of it sperm at 4:30 shortened sail at 9 kept of S.W. at 12 luffed to to S.E. at 7 A.M. set whole top sails and wore ship to S. westward fresh breeze from S.E. latter part the weather the same the two above mention sails in sight

Tuesday June 15<sup>th</sup> P.M. wore ship to S.E. at 4:30 took in sail at 2 A.M. wore ship to S.W. at 11 wore to the eastward fresh gales from S.E. steering by under double reefed top sails
