P.M. the weather continues the same steering E.N.E. under double reefed top sails saw three sails standing to the Westward at 7 we heaved to the wind to the N.E. at 7 A.M. set fore and main sail and kept way S.E. at 9 raised a creak at 10 heaved to the westward latter fresh gale and rain saw a sail standing to the westward

Thursday Nov 11th P.M. fresh gale and sail at 1 took in fore and mizzen top sails at 4 the wind came to S.W. clear of at 8 were ship to N.W. at 8 A.M. were ship to Eastward at 11 raised B. whales lowered and chait but without success

Thursday Nov 12th P.M. lowered and struck a B. whale and drew at 7 double reefed the top sails nearly calm a number of whales in sight to the westward at 4 M were ship to the N.W. at 7 Raised two B. whales lowered and chait but without success at 8 kept of E.N.E. at 10 spoke the Ship Main Capt. Fisher Fairhaven 14 months out 600 lbs of oil 250 of it sperm latter fresh breeze and fine weather from the westward

Saturday November 13th 1847

P.M. heaved to the wind to the S.W. at 7 double reefed the top sails and were ship to the north brisk breeze at 5 A.M. set all sail at 11 were ship to the N.E. nothing in sight

Saturday Nov 14th P.M. brisk breeze from N.W. steering by S tacks aboard with all sail set at 7 double reefed the top sails and were ship to the westward one sail in sight of the lee quarter at 5 A.M. set all sail & were ship to the Eastward latter brisk breeze and haze from N.W.

Monday Nov 15th P.M. fresh breeze and sun being from N at 3 took in main top & sail and main sail at 7 double reefed the top sails steering by S tacks aboard at 9 comes on fresh gale took in fore and mizzen top sails at 1 A.M. were ship to the N.W. at 5 took in fore sail and close reefed the main top sail latter blowing a heavy gale from N to N.W.

Tuesday Nov 16th P.M. the gale continues heavy and came to the westward lying under close reef main top sail and staysails S tacks aboard middle and latter the gale much the same
