 to the S.W. at 6 set whole top sails at 8 wore

 middle fresh gale and rain at 7 A.M. clear
 of fine weather kept away S latter fresh
 gale from N.W.

Thursday December 9th 1847
 P.M. fresh gale and fine weather
 from N.W. steering S under double reef top sails
 at 4 raised sail standing S.E. middle the weather
 continues the same at 8 set whole top sails and kept
 S, S.E. latter fresh gale from W.S.W.
 Sat obs 44:41

Friday Dec 10th P.M. fresh gale from
 W.S.W. steering S, S.E. under whole top sails
 at 8 took in fore and mizzen top sails and
 double reefed the main and luffed to S.W.
 at 8 A.M. kept of S, E at 10 kept E, S, E latter
 fresh breeze from W.S.W.
 Sat obs 45:58

Saturday Dec 11th P.M. luffed to to the north
 at 4 double reefed the top sails at 7:30 took in
 fore and mizzen top sails fresh gale from S.W.
 and clear weather at 8 A.M. wore ship to the
