P.M. light breeze from S.W. and thick lowry weather steering S.W. under double reef top sails and courses latter part light breeze from S.E. and thick lowry weather set whole top sails and main top G. sail Sat. hal. obs 48-13

Sunday April 30th P.M. light breeze and thick fog from S.E. steering S.W. by compass with all sail set middle part more breeze latter fresh gale double reefed the top sails fresh gale and flying clouds from S.W. Sat. obs 50-03

Monday April May 1st 1848

P.M. fresh gale from S.W. steering S.W. under double reef top sails latter part moderate breeze and fine weather steering S.W. under whole top sails
Sat. obs 51-27

Tuesday May 2nd at 3 P.M. raised R. whale lowered and started at him but without success at 6.00 lowered for and the same result at 8 double reefed the top sails light breeze and cloudy several whales in sight at 12 wore ship at daylight raised R. whale lowered and chased without success at 8 chased and other latter light breeze and snow and hail and cold as the Devil

Wednesday May 3rd thick lowry weather double reefed the top sail and steered by on dipnet's tack latter light breeze and fine weather saw a ship tack a whale

Thursday May 4th 1848

P.M. nearly calm and cloudy at 2 lowered and chased R. whale but he was gone quick to S.E. the last mention sail in sight at sunset double reefed the top sails and kept S.W. at 2 A.M. holed aback the main top latter thick fog and fresh breeze from S.E. Sat. est 51-40
Song est 161-30

Friday May 5th P.M. fresh breeze and thick fog from S.E. steered by under double reef top sails at 7 wore ship to Eastward middle rain at 2 A.M. wore ship to westward at 9 wore to S. eastward latter blowing fresh from S.W. Sat. obs 52-27
Song by Chron 161-25

Saturday May 6th P.M. set Jib and main sail blowing fresh gale from S.W. steering by S. tacks aboard middle part the weather continues the same at 6 A.M. the wind came to S.E. wore ship to S.W. latter fresh gale and lowry Sat. est 51-50
Song est 161-15

Sunday May 7th P.M. fresh gale and thick lowry weather from S.E. steering by S. tacks aboard saw a R. whale turn tale at 6 wore ship to the S.E. middle part fresh gale latter more moderate set Jib and main sail and wore to S.W.
Sat. obs 51-39

Monday May 8th P.M. brisk breeze and fine weather from S.W. steering by S. tacks aboard saw sun huprip. Dacks at 4 raised R. whale lowered but without success middle part calm at 10 A.M. light breeze from the westward raised whale and chased the same result
