lowered and struck one but but but his nose
he run away at 6 cut the line about 8 miles
to the windward of the Ship at 8 double reefed
the top sails light breeze and frequent
squalls of snow latter part fresh gale and
and snow from N.W. steering by on different tacks
Sat. obs 51-31.24

Wednesday May 10th P.M. wore Ship to S.W. &
fresh gale and frequent squalls of snow and at
cock as the Scyll at 1 A.M. wore Ship to S. westward
latter light breeze and fine weather from the westward
saw R. whales and chased but he was too wild
Sat. obs 51-41.87
Long est. 160 40 W

Thursday May 11th P.M. light breeze and
cloudy from the westward at 4 lowered and chased
a cow and calf at 8 double reefed the top sails
fresh breeze and sun snow from W. S. W. at 6 A.M.
raised R. whales and started at one and mist him
latter part fresh gale and snow from N.W.
Sat. obs 52 10.24

Friday May 12th P.M. double reefed the top
sails and took in the main sail fresh gale
and snow from N.W. at 5 more moderate
raised two R. whales lowered and chased but
without success middle and latter light
breeze and fine weather saw two R. whales gayne
quick to the north.

Saturday May 13th 1848
P.M. kept of S.W. light
breeze and fine weather from N.W. at 3 raised
R. whale lowered and chased him without success
came on board and kept of S.W. at 2 A.M. wore
Ship to N. eastward middle comes on fresh gale look in
fore and mizzen top sails at 8 wore to the westward
latter blowing fresh gale from N.W. Sat. obs 51 50.87
Long est 160 20 W

Sunday May 14th P.M. the gale continues fresh
from N.W. lying under double reef main top
sail and fore sail heading to the westward middle
and latter parts the gale continues the same close reefed
the main top sail lying to on different tacks on off

Monday May 15th P.M. fresh gale and sun
snow from the westward lying under close reef main
top sail and fore sail heading to S. westward middle
part more moderate at 8 A.M. raised R. whales cat.
fast and drew latter light breeze and fine weather
Sat. obs 51-25.87
Long by Chron 160-12 W

Tuesday May 16th P.M. light breeze and fine
weather from S.W. at 2 struck R. whale two boats
and the iron cut both the lines and the whale went
off with three irons in him at 10 wore Ship to N.E.
at 4 A.M. lowered for R. whale but without success latter
fresh gale from S.W. double Sat. obs 51-50.87
Long est 160-08 W

Wednesday May 17th P.M. fresh gale from S.W.
at 6 took in fore and mizzen top sails plenty whales
in sight at 10 wore Ship to N.E. at 8 A.M. wore to
the north latter fresh gale and heavy from S.W.
lying under close reef main top sail and fore sail
160 04
