

Tuesday June 6th 1848

P.M. the gale continues the same one sail in sight to the leeward saw several R. whales middle and latter fresh gale and thick lowry weather Sat. est 51-40.

Wednesday June 7th P.M. fresh gale and lowry from S.W. lying under close reef main top sail heading to S. westward the last mentioned sail in sight latter part more moderate set whole top sails Sat obs 56-36 R.
Long by Chron 158-30

Thursday June 8th P.M. light breeze and haze from the north on bent the main top sail and bent an after. at 5 lowered and charted R. whale at double reefed the top sails middle light airs from the north at 8 lowered for R. whale without success latter light airs from W.S.W.
Sat obs 50-20 R.
Long est 158-20 W

Friday June 9th P.M. fresh breeze and cloudy from W.S.W. at 1 lowered and struck R. whale and one boat hauled and the others to get their lines out by the irons and the whale went off with 6 irons in him at 7 double reefed the top sails thick fogg at 10 wore ship to the south at 8 A.M. wore to the north latter part light breeze and thick fogg from W.S.W.

Sunday June 11th 1848

P.M. raised a dead whale at 1-30 got him long side at 2 commence cutting him at 4 got him fin lost the head at 9 commence boiling at 7 A.M. comes on fresh gale and rain from E.S.E. took in fore and mizzen top sail latter heading to the ^{south} and the watch employed in boiling

Monday June 12th P.M. 8 M. more moderate the watch employed in boiling at 4 the wind came to the south at 8 A.M. wore ship to the eastward latter fresh gale and thick lowry weather

Tuesday June 13th P.M. fresh gale and rain from S.E. the watch employed in boiling at 3 finished latter thick lowry weather all hands employed in stowing down in the after hold

Wednesday June 14th P.M. thick lowry lowry weather from S.E. all hands employed in stowing down middle the wind came to the eastward and comes on fresh gale and rain lying under double reef main top sail and fore sail heading to the north latter the weather continues the same no obs

Thursday June 15th P.M. the weather the same latter the wind came to the westward and cleared of the watch employed in stowing down
