

Monday June 26th 1848
P.M. a dead calm and thick fog plenty
of R. whales round the ship middle and latter
calm and fog no obs

Tuesday June 27th at 2 P.M. hit up plenty
of R. whales in sight lowered and got slithy
fast to one and hauled at 5 thick fog
and nearly calm latter fresh gale from S.W.
no obs

Wednesday June 28th P.M. the wind came
to S.W. and blows on heavy gale at 6 took
in fore top sail and wore ship to the westward
middle and latter nearly calm chased whales
but without success two sails in sight no obs

Thursday June 29th at 3 P.M. struck
R. whale and hauled at 4 spoke the ship
Montano Russell Nantucket 34 months out 1900
at 5 lowered and chased whales ashore comes
on thick and rain and fresh gale from
the eastward saw the M. Boats fast to a whale
at 7 double reefed the top sails and other sail
in sight at 2 A.M. the wind came to S.E.
and blows on heavy gale took in fore top sail
heading to S. westward Sat. obs 55:17.5
no obs

Friday June 30th at 4 P.M. wore ship
to the eastward more moderate on sail
in sight to the windward middle and
latter part light breeze and thick fog as
was from the eastward steering by on
different tacks plenty of R. whales
and thick fog Sat. est 55:30

Saturday July 1st 1848
P.M. light breeze and
thick as the Swift at 2 wore to S.E.
and shot what to be done middle and latter
part thick fog and light from the north.
Sat. obs 55:29

Sunday July 2nd at 3 P.M. the fog hit
up plenty of whales in sight lowered and got
fast and got slithy stove at 5 hauled 5 irons
from the whale and he went off at 5
thick fog again and fresh breeze from
the north at 6 double reefed the top
sails at 7 A.M. dead of fine weather plenty of whales
came quick to the eastward and 11 struck one
no ends no obs

Monday July 3rd at 4 P.M. took the whale
along side at 9 got him in at 10 spoke
the ship Julyan Tabor New Bedford 12 months
out 1000 lbs at 8 A.M. set all sail and wore ship
to the westward brisk breeze and fine weather
from the westward latter nearly calm and fine
weather Sat. obs 55:18.5

Tuesday July 4th P.M. calm and fine weather
the watch employed in repairing a boat
and cutting up blubber at 5 took light breeze
from the eastward stered by stacks aboard at 8
double reefed the top sails middle fresh breeze took
in fore and mizzen top sails at 8 A.M. heavy gale
wore ship and took in fore sail and close
reefed main top sail latter the weather the
same Sat. obs 55:56.8
