 P.M. heavy gale from the
 eastward lying under close reef main top sail
 heading from S to S.W. middle and latter the
 gale came to the N.E. and continues blowing
 much the same Sat. obs 56-10
 Long by Chron 145 26

Thursday July 6th P.M. the gale continues
 fresh from S.W. lying under close reef main top
 sail heading to the eastward at 8 A.M. set fore sail
 and fore top sail and kept of E.N.E. and commenced
 boiling latter fresh gale from the N.W. and
 Sat. obs 55 49 N
 Long by Chron 144 21 W
 Long by Lunar 144 33

Friday June 7th P.M. fresh gale from the N.W.
 steering E.N.E. under double reef top sails the
 watch employed in boiling middle and latter
 light air and foggy from the westward no obs

Saturday July 8th P.M. the foggy light air
 saw 2 whales and chased but without success
 at 3 spoke the Ship Caroline Capt. Carry N. Beddard
 2300 lbs middle steered E.N.E. latter light
 breeze and sun foggy one other in sight no obs

Sunday July 9th at 1 P.M. spoke the Ship
 Cincinnati Capt. Williams 6 whales this season
 middle and latter light breeze and hazy
 from S.W. steering by S tacks aboard with
 all sail set the two above mention sail in
 sight latter the weather continues the same
 no obs

Monday July 10th 1848
 P.M. light air and hazy from
 S.W. steering by S tacks aboard the last mention
 sail in sight at 6 saw the 2 Ships Boats chasing
 a whale middle and latter part light breeze and
 hazy from the westward saw the Cincinnati
 standing to the eastward Sat. obs 53-37
 Long by Chron 146 24

Tuesday July 11th P.M. light breeze and
 hazy from the westward steering by S tacks
 aboard with all sail set at 8 double reefed the top
 sails at 4 P.M. set top sails latter fresh breeze and
 hazy from S.W. steering by S tacks aboard
 Sat. obs 53-03
 Long by Chron 141-30

Wednesday July 12th P.M. the weather the
 same at 8 double reefed the top sails at 7 A.M.
 saw two whales came to the eastward quick latter
 light breeze and hazy from S.W. steering by
 S tacks aboard with all sail set no obs

Thursday July 13th P.M. light breeze and
 hazy from S.W. steering by S tacks aboard with
 all sail set at 5 tacked to N.E. at 8 double
 reefed fore and mizzen top sails latter part
 fresh breeze and cloudy from S.W. steering by with
 all sail set S tacks aboard no obs

Friday July 14th P.M. fresh breeze and hazy
 from S.W. steering by S tacks aboard with all
 sail set at 8 double reefed the top sails at 6 A.M.
 set all sail light breeze and fine weather from S.W.
 spoke the Barque George Capt. Taylor Stonington
 3 whales this season Sat. obs 53-15
 Long by Chron 140-16 W
