

Saturday July 15th 1848
at 2 P.M. tacked to the eastward
at 3 tacked to the westward light breeze and
thick fog from N.E. latter part the light
breeze and cloudy steering W with all sail set
no obs

Sunday July 16th P.M. light breeze and cloudy
from the south steering W with all sail set
at 8 double reefed the top sails nothing in sight
latter part the weather much the same
Sat obs 54.10 N
Long by Chron 141.52

Monday July 17th P.M. light breeze and fine
weather from south steering by stacks aboard
with all sail set at 8 double reefed the top sails
at daylight set all sail latter light breeze and fine
weather
no obs

Tuesday July 18th P.M. light breeze and fine
weather from South steering by with all sail
set at 9 saw R whale at 1 P.M. saw two more
lowered and hoisted without success latter steered
S.W. light air from N.E. no obs

Wednesday July 19th P.M. light air
from N.E. steering S.W. with all sail set
at 9 A.M. saw a sail standing to the N.E.
latter light breeze and fine weather from N.W.
Sat obs 54.18 N
Long by Chron 141.30 W

Thursday July 20th P.M. raised and other
sail standing to the westward at 4 we tacked
ship to the N.E. light breeze and fine weather
from N.W. latter thick fog and a dead calm
Sat obs 54.30 N

Friday July 21st 1848
P.M. light air from the S.W.
steered N.E. with all sail set at 4 kept N.E.
one sail in sight standing to N.W. middle and
latter parts fresh breeze and cloudy from S.E.
Sat obs 55.16 N
no obs

Saturday July 22nd
P.M. brisk breeze and cloudy
from S.E. steering by stacks aboard with
all sail set middle and latter part the breeze
light
Sat obs 55.14
Long by Chron 141.26

Sunday July 23rd P.M. nearly calm
and cloudy at 5 raised two R whales lowerd but
they took off at 8 double reefed the top sails at 10
hauled aback main top sail latter fresh breeze
and cloudy from S.E. steering by stacks aboard
no obs

Monday July 24th P.M. at 4 raised R
whale lowerd and killed him at 8 got him
long side and took in sail fresh breeze and
thick lowry weather at 6 A.M. nearly calm
commence cutting ends calm and foggy
no obs

Tuesday July 25th at 9 P.M. finished
cutting calm and foggy all hands employed in
clearing up decks at 5 commence bailing at 7 A.M.
spoke the Hydor New Bedford capt. Eldridge 18 men
out 200 lbs sperm latter light breeze and fine
weather from Eastward one other sail in
sight round on for us
