Wednesday Dec 27th P.M. fresh breeze and flying clouds from the eastward steering by S tacks aboard with all sail set the above mentioned sail in sight on the weather beam middle and latter the wind light

Thursday Dec 28th P.M. light breeze from the eastward steering by S tacks aboard with all sail set the watch employed in Ship Duty the above mentioned sail in sight ahead middle part calm at 5 A.M. took light breeze from S.W. kept S.E. latter all hands employed in Coopersing oil in the after hold no obs

Friday Dec 29th P.M. all hands employed in Coopersing oil at 1, came on fresh gale from S.E. took in fore and mizzen top sails and double reefed the main at 6 wore Ship to the south at 7 wore to N.E. latter fresh breeze & lying under double reefed main top sail and fore sail

Saturday Dec 30th 1848

P.M. light breeze and fine weather from the eastward lying under double reef main top sail and fore sail all hands employed in Coopersing oil latter brisk breeze from S.W. set fore and mizzen top sails steered by S tacks aboard all hands employed in wetting hole and stowing of no obs

Sunday Dec 31st P.M. set all sail brisk breeze from S.W. steering by S tacks aboard the watch employed variously middle and latter parts light airs inclining to calms

Monday January 1st 1849

P.M. nearly calm and cloudy at 4 light airs from the eastward steering by S tacks aboard with all sail set at 12 M. took light breeze from N.W. & set fore top mast studding sail and main top & studding sail latter the weather much the same no obs

Tuesday Jan 2nd P.M. brisk breeze and cloudy from the N.E. steering S.E. by compass with studding sails set the watch employed in Ship Duty middle the wind coming to the eastward took in studding sails latter fresh gale and fowry from the E.S.E. steering by S tacks aboard with all sail set
