

Thursday Jan 10th 1849

at 1 P.M. commence cutting at 4 got him in at 7 wore ship to the S.E. and double reefed the top sails and commence sailing at 6 A.M. lowered for the Whales but without success at 10 wore ship to the north latter fresh gale from the eastward steering by stacks aboard under double reef top sails and let the watch employed in sailing Sat Obs 47-25 Longest 151-30 W

Wednesday Jan 11th P.M. fresh gale and hazy from the eastward steering by under double reef top sails the watch employed in sailing saw one R. Whale to rug at 7 A.M. finished sailing nearly calm and thick fog saw 3 R. Whales Sat Obs 46-35 Longest 151-00

Thursday Jan Friday Jan 12th P.M. calm and thick the watch employed variously 3 R. Whales in sight about 6 miles of middle and latter part calm and cloudy all hands employed in stowing down in the after hold no obs

Saturday Jan 13th P.M. calm all hands employed in stowing down in the after hold at 4 finished at 11 took light breeze from the north steered by stacks aboard at 5 A.M. set all sail brisk breeze and fine weather steering by on different tracks

Sunday January 14th 1849

at 3 P.M. lowered for R. Whale but without success brisk breeze and fine weather from the N.E. came on Board and wet hole at 7 double reefed the top sails at 7 lowered for two R. Whales and darted at them but without success latter part fresh breeze and flying clouds from the N.W. steering different courses Sat Obs 47-25 Long by Chron 150-50

Monday Jan 15th P.M. lowered for R. Whale but without success fresh gale from the N.W. kept E with main top G sail set at 7 double reefed the top sails at 6 lowered and chased R. Whale the same result at 10 wore ship to the westward middle comes on fresh gale and rain from N.W. at 6 A.M. kept away E latter the weather continues the same no obs

Tuesday Jan 16th P.M. fresh gale and rain from N.W. steering E by compass under double reefed top sails on fore sail at 4 kept E 4 N middle more moderate set main top G sail latter light breeze and thick fog weather set studding sails no obs

Wednesday Jan 17th P.M. calm and thick fog and a heavy swell on at 4 took a breeze from S.E. at 10 comes on heavy gale and rain double reefed the top sails at 1 A.M. the gale increases took in fore and mizzen top sails and close reefed the main latter heavy gale and cloudy from N.E. no obs
