 Sunday, Nov. 3, 1854.

These 24 hours begin with brisk breeze from the S.E. ship under all sail steering by the wind to the S.W. saw nothing watches employed as usual, at 7 P.M. the ship up & off S.W. the middle and outer parts continue a fine pleasant breeze from the S.E. ship under all sail steering by the wind to the S.W. at 11 A.M. passed a brig, steering to the Eastward, so ends this day.
