

Monday, Sept. 15. 1851.

These 24 hours begins with fine pleasant breeze from the S.W. ship under all possible sail. Steering S.E. & E. saw nothing. at 1 P.M. winds light. the middle part continues the same wind sails to the right. the latter part winds baffling from S.W. to S.E. all hands employed cleaning ship. saw nothing.

Lat. 34° 45' N. Long. 158° 34' W. June 20 miles East.

Tuesday, Sept. 16.

These 24 hours begins with brisk breeze from the South ship under all sail steering by the wind S.W. & all hands employed cleaning ship. saw nothing. the middle part continues the same. the latter part light breeze from South. watches employed painting ship inside & ends.

Lat. 33° 54' N. Long. 157° 17' W.

Wednesday, Sept. 17.

These 24 hours begins with light breeze from the South. ship under all sail heading E. by S. & watches employed painting ship in side. saw nothing. the middle and latter part continues the same. watches employed painting ship. ship heading E. by S.

Lat. 33° 27' N. Long. 155° 18' W.

Thursday, Sept. 18.

These 24 hours begins with fine pleasant weather winds light from the South. watches employed in ship's deck. the middle and latter part light baffling winds from S. to S.E. watches employed in various jobs about the ship. saw nothing.

Lat. 33° 15' N. Long. 154° 42' W.

Friday, Sept. 19.

These 24 hours begins with light baffling air accompanied with light rain squalls. watches employed as usual. saw nothing. the middle part winds baffling from South to W. at 4 a.m. fine pleasant breeze from the S.W. ship under all possible sail. steering S.E. at 7 a.m. saw a ship ahead. at watches employed cleaning ship, out side and sundry other jobs.

Saturday, Sept. 20. 1851.

These 24 hours begins with light air from the S.W. accompanied with fine pleasant weather. ship under all possible sail steering S.E. at 1 P.M. spoke ship. Hellen Augusta, of New Port. 1 ship Capt. Phailor, came on board. spent the day. watches employed in ship's deck. the middle part light air. the latter part continues much the same. watches employed as usual. ship Hellen Augusta in company. Lat. 31° 35' N. Long. 153° 45' W.

Sunday, Sept. 21.

These 24 hours begins with fine pleasant breeze from S.W. to S.E. at 2 P.M. wind light. steering S.E. ship Hellen Augusta in company. the middle part continues light. the latter part fine pleasant weather wind light from the S.W. Capt. Birdston went on board the ship Hellen Augusta to attend divine service. ship all sail. steering S.E. by S. saw nothing.

Long. 153° 57' W. Lat. 31° 53' N.

Monday, Sept. 22.

These 24 hours begins with a fine pleasant breeze from the S.W. ship under all sail steering S.E. ship H. A. in company. the middle part continues much the same. the latter part light breeze from the East. at 8 a.m. Capt. Phailor came on board and got 325 feet pine board. watches employed painting and fitting ship. steering S.E. at dusk ship H. A. at stern. Lat. 29° 04' N. Long. 153° 57' W.

Tuesday, Sept. 23.

These 24 hours begins with a light breeze from the S.W. ship under all sail steering S.E. watches employed painting and fitting ship. the middle part light squalls of rain. the latter part light air and calms. saw the ship H. A. at stern. watches employed as usual.

Lat. 28° 42' N. Long. 154° 49' W.

Wednesday, Sept. 24.

These 24 hours begins with light baffling air from S.W. to S.E. at 5 a.m. ship to the S.E. at 7 calms. watches employed painting & fitting ship. the middle part winds S.E. at 11. both sails set to the S.W. the latter part continues much the same. watches employed as usual. saw nothing. winds from S.W. to S.E. accompanied with light squalls.

Lat. 27° 44' N. Long. 154° 33' W.
