These 24 hours begins with a fine moderate breeze from the S. E. ship under all sail steering course E. by N. watches employed repairing main top sail. the middle and latter part fine breeze from the S. W. watches employed repairing main sail. saw nothing of note.

Friday, Dec. 5.
These 24 hours begins with a fine pleasant breeze from the S. E. ship under all possible sail steering E. by N. at 8 P.M. saw 2 hump backs. watches employed repairing main sail. at 7 P.M. hauled up S. & E. by E. the middle and latter part fine brisk breeze from the S. E. at 6 p.m. saw the Island of Guadaloupe 8 points on the W. bow 15 miles dist. at 7 a.m. saw a ship 3 points on the Star quarter. steering E. by N. this Island does not agree in its bearings. the Lat. and Long. is both wrong.

Saturday, Dec. 6.
These 24 hours begins with strong breeze from the S. E. ship under all sail steering S. E. & E. at 8 P.M. squally and rain. wind came to the S. & S. W. the middle and latter part fine pleasant weather wind from the S. E. watches employed repairing main sail. ship under all sail steering S. E. by E. saw a sail off the lar case quarter. and saw fine birds. no more.
