

Thursday, Dec^r 18th 1851

These 24 hours begins with a light air from the South Ship under all sail steering E. by S. at 4 P. M. wind can't aft. at 7 P. M. had a light breeze from the West. The middle and latter parts light air and calms saw nothing of acct. watches employed in ship's duty. Lat. 17° 15' N. Long. 142° 38' W.

Friday, Dec^r 19th

These 24 hours begins with a light breeze from the West Ship under all possible sail steering E. by S. saw nothing. The middle and latter parts continues much the same. saw nothing. watches employed as usual. Lat. 16° 43' N. Long. 141° 28' W.

Saturday, Dec^r 20th

These 24 hours begins with a light breeze from the West Ship under all possible sail steering E. by S. saw nothing of acct. the middle and latter parts continues the same. watches employed repairing fore sail. saw nothing steering E. by S. Lat. 16° 44' N. Long. 140° 51' W.

Sunday, Dec^r 21st

These 24 hours begins with a light breeze of wind from the Westward ship under all sail steering E. by S. the middle part continues much the same the latter part light air and calms saw nothing. Lat. 15° 33' N. Long. 139° 38' W.

Monday, Dec^r 22nd

These 24 hours begins with light air and calms. the middle and latter parts continues the same saw nothing. Lat. 15° 37' N.

Tuesday, Dec^r 23rd

These 24 hours begins with strong calms and sun what hot sun. the middle part had a breeze from the West. the latter part light air and calms. saw nothing of account. So ends this day and page. watches employed in ship's duty. Lat. 15° 13' N. Long. 138° 21' W.

Wednesday, Dec^r 24th a.d. 1851

These 24 hours begins with fine pleasant weather accompanied with light air from the Westward ship under all possible sail steering to the E. by S. saw nothing of account. the middle and latter parts light air and calms. with green water and sun swell on. at sun rise saw the land large schools of Dolphin and numerous other fish around. Lat. 14° 48' N. Long. 137° 26' W.

Thursday, Dec^r 25th

These 24 hours begins with calms and light baffling air. saw nothing as usual. watches employed in ship's duty. the middle and latter parts continues the same. all 3 boats down for black fish. did not get shot. Lat. 14° 31' N. Long. 136° 57' W.

Friday, Dec^r 26th

These 24 hours begins with calms. at sun set looked for black fish. got nothing. watches employed as usual. the middle and latter parts continues calms. Lat. 13° 53' N. Long. 136° 18' W.

Saturday, Dec^r 27th

These 24 hours begins with light easterly breeze from the West. ship steering E. by S. the middle and latter parts continues light air from the West. watches employed as usual. Lat. 13° 15' N. Long. 135° 54' W.

Sunday, Dec^r 28th

These 24 hours begins with light air and calms saw nothing. the middle and latter parts continues the same. Lat. 12° 53' N. Long. 135° 57' W.

Monday, Dec^r 29th

These 24 hours begins with light air and calms saw nothing. the middle and latter part light winds from the West. ship under all sail steering E. by S. so ends Lat. 12° 41' N. Long. 135° 11' W.

Tuesday, Dec^r 30th

These 24 hours begins with a fine breeze from the West. ship steering E. by S. the middle part continues the same. the latter part had a 5 knot swell at 8 a.m. flood William Murray. for numerous behavior. saw hump backs. So ends this day. Lat. 11° 11' N. Long. 134° 11' W.
