

Monday June 21. 52.

These 24 hours begins with brisk breeze from the S.E. ship under whole top sail heading S.E. and E.S.E. one ship in sight. saw nothing of art. at 5 o'clock ship to the South. at 8 o'clock took in sail. watching employed sailing. the middle and latter part strong breeze and thick weather. ship under short sail at 6 a.m. finished boiling. all hands employed cleaning bone. so end heading S.E. to 6 o'clock.

Tuesday June 22.

These 24 hours begins with strong breeze from the East. ship under short sail sail heading S.E. all hands employed cleaning bone. at 5 o'clock finished. the weather thick. the middle and latter part continues much the same all hands employed stowing down oil in forward. saw a ship boiling. Lat. 54° 00' N. Long. 158° 00' W.

Wednesday June 23.

These 24 hours begins with strong breeze from the S.W. and thick weather. all hands employed stowing oil at 5 o'clock finished ship heading West. at 7 o'clock took in sail the middle and latter part strong breeze from the North accompanied with thick rain. weather at 9 a.m. set double reef top sails. wore ship to the N. N. W. so ends.

Thursday June 24.

These 24 hours begins with strong breeze from the North. ship under double reef top sails. heading N. N. W. the weather thick and rainy. saw nothing at 7 o'clock in sail. the middle part weather continues the same. the latter part ship under all sail heading N. N. W. at 9 a.m. saw a carriage backed ship to the S. N. E. the Lat 54° 12' N. Long. 158° 35' W.

Friday June 25.

These 24 hours begins with light air from the North. at 1 o'clock looked for whales. barbed boat went on did not get fast. chased until 5 o'clock. came on board at 8 o'clock in sail calm. the middle part continues the same. the latter part moderate breeze from the Eastward ship under all sail heading S.W. the weather dark. and saw fog. saw a carriage.

Saturday June 26. 52.

These 24 hours begins with brisk breeze from the S.E. the weather dark and drizzling. ship under all sail heading S.E. by W. saw a great number of fine backs and millions of whale birds. saw 2 R. Whales going quick at 7 o'clock wore ship to the S.E. and took in sail. the middle part wind shifts gradually to the Westward. the latter part blows a heavy gale accompanied with rain. at 11 o'clock took in the fore sail and raised mast. no more.

Sunday June 27.

These 24 hours begins with strong gale from the West. ship under all sail heading S.E. by W. at 6 o'clock the gale breaks. the middle continues to moderate. at 7 a.m. set double reef top sails. steering S. by N. at 11 o'clock saw 2 R. Whales going to the Westward quick Lat. 53° 58' N. Long. 157° 35' W.

Monday June 28.

These 24 hours begins with moderate breeze from the N. S. W. ship under all sail steering S.E. by E. saw nothing carried sail. at 8 o'clock wind from the S.E. the weather cloudy. the middle and latter part strong breeze from the S. S. E. ship under all sail steering by the wind to thick E. the weather thick and rainy. saw nothing but fine backs no observation.

Tuesday June 29.

These 24 hours begins with brisk breeze from the East. the weather dark. ship under all sail heading N. N. E. saw several fine backs. going to the Eastward. the middle part up S.E. the latter part moderate breeze from the S.E. ship under all sail heading S.E. the weather foggy. Lat of art. 54° 10' N. Long. 157° 40' W.

Wednesday June 30.

These 24 hours begins with light air from the S.E. ship under all sail heading S.E. by E. at 4 o'clock looked for a whale. at 6 o'clock came on board ship in thick fog. at 7 o'clock up S.E. the middle and latter part light air from the Southward. accompanied with thick fog. at 10 o'clock clears off. saw fine backs. so ends this day month and fog. Lat. 55° 32' N. Long. 157° 40' W.
