

Thursday, July 29, '52

These 24 hours begin with light air and calms close in to the Island of Kodiak. Plenty of Kumpbarks around the middle and latter parts. With fog at 11 a.m. went on board ship Stakes. Ship under all sail, heading in shore. Wind S.W.

Friday, July 30, '52

These 24 hours begin with moderate breeze from the N.W. steering in towards the land, in company with ship Stakes at 6 P.M. calm, land 8 miles distant. The middle part had a breeze from the S.W. steered in for a bay at 10 a.m. came to anchor in 13 fathoms. Left bottom at the Island of Kodiak, Lat. 57° N.

Saturday, July 31, '52

These 24 hours begin with brisk breeze from the N.W. at 1 P.M. started with a boat crew took Capt. Hall in proceeded up the bay in search of some Russians. Found some native inhabitants had a confab. with them about whales, farther up the bay we came to the Russian Station where we were treated with every mark of respect, we learned from them that the Whales came in to the bay in August and September, at 9 returned to the ship. The latter part the weather thick, sent a boat fishing, to end at anchor.

Sunday, August 1, '52

These 24 hours begin with moderate breeze had a cruise in another bay, found a hut, and some Whales bones, no natives, the middle part foggy, the latter part fine pleasant weather.

Monday, August 2, '52

These 24 hours begin with fine light breeze from the S.W. at 1 P.M. got under weigh went round into another bay, at 4 P.M. came to anchor in 7 fathoms water. Windy bottom. The middle part calm. The latter part begins with foggy weather at 9 clear up had a cruise with 2 boats, saw several Kump back but no calms.

Tuesday, Aug 3, '52

These 24 hours begin with light air and calms, at 7 P.M. return from a cruise. Saw plenty of Whales in ...

Wednesday, Aug 4, '52

at 7 a.m. got under weigh and head out of the harbor with light air from S.W. at 12 noon brisk breeze, ship under all sail heading S.W. Ship catches in company. The weather thick threatening with a heavy sea from the S.E. Long 152° 44' W. close on mountain

Wednesday, Aug 4, '52

This day begins with strong breeze from the S.W. the weather squally at 3 P.M. finished stowing the anchors, put the chains below, took in the light sails, nearest land bearing N.W. by compass dist 4 miles ship Stakes on the lee quarter, at 8 P.M. put the ship under double reef top, sails, put the main sails, steering S.E. by S. the weather came, and steering a S.W. by W. the middle part wind increased put the sails under close reef top, took in the waist boat. The latter part more moderate, ship under double reef top, Lat. at noon 55° 11' N.

Thursday, Aug 5, '52

This day begins with strong breeze from the S.W. ship under double reef top, sails, steering S.W. by S. at 6 P.M. set single reef top sails and top gal sails. The middle part more moderate set all sails. The latter part thick wind from S.W. to South, ship by the wind with star tacky. Lat. 53° 51' N.

Friday, Aug 6, '52

These 24 hours begin with moderate breeze from the South, with thick misty weather ship under all sail heading S.W. The middle and latter parts continued much the same saw nothing.

Lat. 52° 24' N. Long. 147° 14' W.
