Saturday, Dec 25.

These 24 hours begin with light breeze from the N.E. ship under all sail heading E.S.E. saw Black fish. watches employed painting. At 5 finished killed a Pig. for Christmas. The middle air light airs and calms. The latter part had a breeze from the N.E. around with light squalls. this day struck some and main top gal yards. sent a meat yard to the main and the old main for ward. no other.

Sunday, Dec 26.

begins with a light breeze from the N.E. ship under all sail heading East. saw some breeches caulked them pumps. The middle part light breeze the latter part had a fine breeze from the N.E. ship under all sail heading East. saw nothing. Lat^d 31° 15' S. Long. 112° 48' W.

Monday, Dec 27.

These 24 hours begin with a fine breeze from the N.E. ship under all sail heading East. saw nothing. The middle and latter part continues much the same watches employed repairing fore top sail, at 10 a.m. squared in. the yards wind North saw nothing. Lat^d 32° 04' S. Long. 111° 45' W.

Tuesday, Dec^r 28, '32.

These 24 hours begin with a fine breeze from the N.E. ship under all sail heading East. watches emp^d repairing in top sail. at 6 P.M. wind light. The middle and latter parts continuing the same. watches emp^d as usual. saw nothing. Lat^d 32° 27' S. Long. 110° 52' W.

Wednesday, Dec^r 29.

These 24 hours begin with light airs and calms. watches emp^d repairing sails. saw nothing. the middle and latter parts continuing the same. watches emp^d as usual. Lat^d 32° 33' S.

Thursday, Dec. 30.

These 24 hours begin with calms. watches employed repairing sails. The middle and latter part continuing the same. Lat^d 32° 41' S. Long 109° 38' W.

Friday, Dec^r 31.

begins with calms and light airs from the N.E. and with slight rain squalls. watches employed repairing sails at 4 P.M. saw a school of Black fish. off the lee beam did not come for them. The middle and latter parts continuing light airs and calms. watches emp^d as usual. Lat^d 33° 15' S. Long. 107° 46' W.

Saturday Jan^y 1, '33.

This day and year begins with calms. watches employed repairing sails. saw nothing. The middle and latter parts continuing much the same. watches employed as usual. Lat^d 33° 13' S. Long. 107° 47' W.

Sunday Jan^y 2, '33.

begins with light airs from the N.E. ship under all sail heading East. at 4 P.M. had a breeze from the N.E. The middle and latter parts continuing light baffling winds. Lat^d 33° 04' S. Long. 106° 31' W.

Monday, Jan^y 3.

These 24 hours begin with light baffling winds and calms. at 6 P.M. had a fine shower of rain. wind S.E. to E. the middle part showers. The latter part squally wind. E.S.E. ship heading N. and S. by W. saw nothing. Lat^d 33° 32' S. Long 106° 22' 30' W.
