

Thursday, Mar. 3rd 53

These 24 hours begins with a fine breeze from the S.E. ship under all sail steering N. by E. watches employed setting up rigging fishing gear yard. the latter part finished the fore yard sent it aloft. ship under all sail steering S. by E. watches employed in ship's duty. Lat. 12° 00' S. Long. 87° 25' W.

Friday, Mar. 4th

These 24 hours begins with a fine pleasant breeze from the S.E. ship under all possible sail steering N. by E. watches employed as usual. Capt. P. at work fitting a whale boat. at 7 P.M. steered N. by E. 1/2 N. the middle and latter part weather continuing the same to end Lat. 11° 54' S. Long. 89° 17' W.

Saturday, Mar. 5th

These 24 hours begins with a fine breeze from the S.E. ship under all possible sail steering N. by E. watches employed in ship's duty. the middle and latter part continuing the same. Capt. P. at work making last rail for the masts steering course N. by E. 1/2 N. Lat. 11° 11' S. Long. 91° 17' W.

Sunday, Mar. 6th

These 24 hours begins with a fine pleasant breeze from the S.E. ship under all possible sail steering N. by E. watches employed fitting cutting pendant. the middle part had some rain the latter part light breeze with passing clouds and fine rain. Lat. 8° 55' S. Long. 92° 48' W.

Monday, Mar. 7th

These 24 hours begins with a moderate breeze from the S.E. ship under all sail steering N. by E. watches employed as usual. the middle and latter part continuing much the same. watches employed as usual. so ends Mar Lat. 7° 53' S.

Tuesday, Mar. 8th

These 24 hours begins with moderate breeze from the S.E. ship under all possible sail steering N. by E. watches employed as usual. the middle part squally. the latter part more steady. Lat. 6° 31' S. Long. 96° 48' W.

Wednesday, Mar. 9th 53.

These 24 hours begins with a moderate breeze from the S.E. with a large swell from the South. at 8 P.M. raining ship under all sail steering N. by E. watches employed in ship's duty. the middle and latter part continuing the same. Lat. 5° 14' S. Long. 100° 11' W.

Thursday, Mar. 10th

These 24 hours begins with a moderate breeze from the S.E. ship under all possible sail steering N. the middle and latter part continuing the same. watches employed in ship's duty. saw nothing of account. so ends Lat. 4° 27' S. Long. 101° 38' W.

Friday, Mar. 11th

These 24 hours begins with a brisk breeze from the S.E. ship under all sail steering course N. by E. by compass watches employed fitting over potatoes and sundry other jobs. the middle part continuing the same. the latter part watches employed fitting cutting pendant. Mar Lat. 4° 18' S.

Saturday, Mar. 12th

These 24 hours begins with a fine breeze from the S.E. to S. S.E. ship under all possible sail steering N. by E. watches employed fitting cutting pendant. the middle part had some rain the latter part light breeze with passing clouds and fine rain. Lat. 4° 14' S.

Sunday, Mar. 13th

These 24 hours begins with squally weather accompanied with plenty of rain. ship under all sail steering N. by E. at 8 P.M. saw spouts of the weather guage hauled the ship by the wind at 4 thick and rain came up N. by E. again. the middle and latter part continuing much the same. Lat. 4° 11' S. Long. 108° 35' W.

Monday, Mar. 14th

These 24 hours begins with light squally and squally weather with from all quarters, and plenty of rain. the middle part fresh breeze from the S.E. the latter part continuing much the same. at 8 a.m. saw a squall 3 miles off 3 points on the weather bow. by a bark 1 hour saw nothing. Lat. 4° 26' S. Long. 111° 14' W.
