These 24 hours begins with a fine breeze from the Eastward. Ship under all sail steering N. by E. at 4 P.M. bene up. D. by E. The middle and latter parts continuing much the same. Saw nothing.  
Lat. 1° 34' N. Long. 143° 35' W.

Monday, Mar. 28.

These 24 hours begins with a light breeze from the Eastward. Ship under all sail steering W. by E. The middle and latter parts continuing much the same. Watches employed in various jobs about the ship. Lat. 2° 11' N. Long. 146° 17' W.

Tuesday, Mar. 29.

These 24 hours begins with a very light breeze from the Eastward. Ship under all sail steering W. by E. The middle and latter parts light air watches employed as usual.  
Lat. 3° 11' N. Long. 148° 11' W.

Wednesday, Mar. 30.

These 24 hours begins with a light breeze from the Eastward. Ship under all sail steering W. by E. The middle and latter squally, and raining.  
Lat. by act. 3° 45' N. Long. 149° 36' W.

Thursday, Mar. 31.

These 24 hours begins with squally weather winds from the Eastward. Ship under all sail steering N. by E. The middle and latter parts continuing much the same. Watches employed in ships duty. So ends this day and month.  
Lat. 3° 23' N. Long. 151° 55' W.

Friday, April 1.

These 24 hours begins with squally weather winds from the Eastward. Ship under all sail steering N. by E. The middle and latter parts continuing the same. Saw nothing of ast. So ends ship under all sail steering N. by E.

Lat. 3° 23' N. Long. 154° 00' W.

Saturday, April 2/53.

These 24 hours begins with squally weather accompanied with rain and a heavy sea from the N.E. Ship under all sail steering West. The middle part continuing much the same. The latter part more steady. Watches continued making out castles picking the cone and main sails in case.  
Lat. 3° 36' N. Long. 156° 28' W.

Sunday, April 3.

These 24 hours begins with a fine breeze from the Eastward. Ship under all sail steering West. The middle and latter parts continuing the same. Saw nothing.  
Lat. 3° 35' N. Long. 158° 52' W.

Monday, April 4.

These 24 hours begins with squally rainy weather at 3 P.M. took in top gal. sails and set double reef top sails. Hauled by the 10 to the south. Blowing strong. The middle part moderate the latter part fine breeze.  
Lat. 3° 49' N. Long. 159° 06' W.

Tuesday, April 5.

These 24 hours begins with a fine breeze from the Eastward. Ship under all sail steering S. by E. at 2 P.M. Steered at W. by W. at 4 P.M. kept off N. by E. at 8 took in the light sail hauled too. with the main yard aback. The middle part squally. the latter part clear weather. at daylight saw the land on the beam. 8 miles dist. at all sails were down. off the barbor went on shore with 2 boats. Chron is 30 miles to Eastward. Turnings Island. is 30 miles to the Eastward of its situation on the chart. its position. Lat. 3° 55' N. Long. 159° 20' and on. Roma marked in the ship.

Wednesday, April 6.

at 3 P.M. hoisted the yards steered N. by E. at 4 hauled up N. by E. winds from the south. The middle and latter parts light baffling winds from S. E. to E. by N. watches employed in various jobs about the ship.
