

Thursday, April, 7/53

These 24 hours begins with light baffling winds from the Eastward. Ship under all sail steering S. by E. The weather squally, watches employed as usual. at 7 P.M. bore up S. by E. the middle part continues under the same, the latter part cloudy with light baffling air. Lat. 15° 42' N. at noon.

Friday, April, 8.

These 24 hours begins with light baffling winds accompanying with thick rainy weather, winds from S. by E. to North. the middle part continues much the same, the latter coming with calms. at 8 a.m. lowered all 3 boats for black fish came on a hard squall boats came on board, ends with good weather Lat. 7° 41' N. Long 160° 44' W.

Saturday, Apr. 9.

These 24 hours begins with a fine breeze from the S. E. ship under all sail steering S. by E. at 4 P.M. the weather squally, winds from the Eastward, and torrents of rain. the middle and latter part continues a good breeze, watches employed in various jobs about the ship. Lat. 6° 21' N. at 12 M.

Sunday, April, 10.

These 24 hours begins with a fine breeze from the Eastward ship under all possible sail steering S. by E. at 7 P.M. had the wind S. E. the middle and latter part rainy weather winds from S. E. to S. W. no observation.

Monday, April, 11.

These 24 hours begins with thick rain, squally with winds S. W. at 4 P.M. hauled by the wind with the main yard aback, the middle part thick with little or no wind the latter part light breezes from the S. E. saw nothing watches employed in ship's duty. Lat. 11° 39' N.

Thursday, April, 12/53.

These 24 hours begins with a light breeze from the S. E. ship under all sail steering S. by E. watches employed as usual. this day gave a new set of fore top sail braces, at 6 P.M. showed. the middle and latter part fine breezes watches employed in ship's duty. Lat. 13° 58' N. Long 165° 36' W.

Wednesday, April, 13.

These 24 hours begins with brisk breezes from the S. E. ship under all possible sail steering S. by E. the middle part continues much the same. The latter part winds more steady, with passing clouds, watches emp. as usual, by Lunar 167° 53' Lat. 14° 24' N. Long 168° 01' W.

Thursday, April, 14.

These 24 hours begins with a fine breeze from the S. E. ship under all possible sail steering S. by E. watches emp. in various jobs about the ship. the middle and latter part continues the same. by Lunar 170° 38' W. Lat. 15° 53' N. Long 170° 49' W.

Friday, April, 15.

These 24 hours begins with a fine brisk breeze from the S. E. ship under all possible sail steering S. by E. watches emp. as usual. the middle and latter part continues a strong breeze ship under all sail going on well Lat. 17° 31' N. Long 174° 01' W.

Saturday, April, 16.

These 24 hours begins with a strong steady ship under all possible sail steering S. by E. watches emp. as usual. the middle and latter part continues much the same. Lat. 19° 29' N. Long 177° 10' W. 230.

Sunday, April, 17.

These 24 hours begins with a fine breeze from the S. E. ship under all possible sail steering S. by E. watches emp. in ship's duty. the middle part squally the latter part strong breezes from the S. E. ship under all sail steering S. by E. this day crossed the meridian.
