

From Plymouth Towards the N. E. side

Wednesday Sept. 23 1840 Sea breeze

the wind N. West sunset Plymouth light 7 41 1/2
10 miles distant at 5 1/2 light left us 10. Cape Cod
light bore S. E. dist 12. Mice 23 past. Morden & Co.
bore S. W. 20. M. latter light bore from S. W.
Several sail in sight so E. wind Lat 42. 34 Long. 69. 55

Thursday Sept 24th
Commenced with light breeze from S. W.
and pleasant all hands employed in stowing
Anchors setting up rigging &c. Mice calm latter
strong breeze N. E. 1 sail in sight Lat 41. 49 Long 66. 56

Friday Sept 25th
Commenced with wind N. E. and cloudy the weather
layed in fishing boats Mice wind the same latter
sailed to E. all hands preparing for whaling
Lat 40. 36 Long 64. 00

Saturday Sept 26th
Commenced light breeze from E. and pleasant. Mice
wind latter the same employed in fishing boats
Lat 39. 53 Long 64. 34

Sunday Sept 27th
Commenced with fresh gales from E. steady
and the wind S. E. Mice the same D. 6. 8 1/2
Tacked ship to the N. E. Lat 38. 45 Long 62. 00

Monday 28th 1840
Commenced fresh gales from S. E. on the wind S. E.
Mice the same latter calm so E. wind Lat 39. 44 Long 60. 00

Tuesday 29. 1840
Commenced light breeze S. W. with lightning Course S. by E.
latter strong gales attended with thunder
lightning and took in top gaff sails Lat 40. 15 Long 58. 00
