Thursday March 18th 1841

First part strong gales from E. and rainy & 12 miles
hept her off N by E 24 P.M. how her to mid & latter
about the same No Obs.

Friday March 19th

First part being too in a S.W. gale with some rain
latter none coming to N. with rain No Obs.

Saturday March 20th

Comd with heavy gales S.W. & rainy being too under
close view M. top & storm stay sails & 4 P.M. the
Ocean appeared to be all in a foam then the M. top
all to pieces & 12 moderated latter some rain broke
out the storage and let the water down Lat 26 30 Long 112 10

Sunday March 21st

First part wind to S.W. & set the foresail and bent
another M. top latter wind about the same made
all sail bound to the N. Lat 25 25 Long 111 53

Monday March 22^d

First part wind came to S.W. with squalls of
rain course N. mid & latter the same No Obs.

Tuesday March 23^d

First part light breeze from S with some rain
course N. latter about the same Lat 22 24 Long 112 11

Wednesday March 24th

Comd light breeze from S. & 4 hauled her in for
Korea C. latter the same & 11 A.M. made the N. Cape
35 miles dist Lat 22 5 Long 113 9

Thursday March 25th

First part light breeze S.W. course N. bent the
old suit sails & painted the S.P. latter about
the same falling M. top Lat 20 27 Long 113 35

Friday March 26th

First part fine breeze S.W. course N.E. at
sunset took in top gal. latter steering E. employed
in fathoming M. top Lat 19 41 Long 114 40

Saturday March 27th 1841

First part light breeze S.W. & latter the same
Lat 20 2 Long 115 50

Sunday March 28th

First part light breeze S.W. course E.S.E. fine weather
on top saw a number of snakes & mid & latter light
breeze E.S.E. Lat 19 33 Long 118 00

Monday March 29th

First part light breeze E.S.E. & calm saw a number
snakes & sharks found a strong current setting E.
latter fine breeze S.W. course N. Lat 18 33 Long 117 46

Tuesday March 30th

First part light breeze S.W. mid & latter about the same
employed in mending sails Lat 18 12 Long 117 43

Wednesday March 31st

First part light variable airs & calm caught a turtle mid
& latter about the same Lat 17 34 Long 118 17

Thursday April 1st

First part light airs S.W. employed in repairing sails
latter about the same cruising for whales Lat 17 34 Long 118 45

Friday April 2^d

First part light airs at sunset headed off shore mid
& latter light airs S.W. mending sails Lat 17 34 Long 119 17

Saturday April 3^d

First part light airs sun & chased a sperm whale
and not get fast mid & latter light airs & calm 17 30 17 30

Sunday April 4th

First part light airs & calm cruising for whale latter fine
gales from E with thunder lightning & some rain 16 30 17 30

Monday April 5th

First part light breeze E.S.E. on the wind & 8. latter about
the same & 12 tacked to the S. Lat 15 40 Long 117 33

Tuesday April 6th

Comd light airs E.S.E. heading to the S. saw a number
of finbacks & painted the S.P. latter painted the S.P.
No Enies this 24th Lat 16 54 Long 117 33
