

Bark Fortune in the Pacific Ocean
Tuesday March 29th 1842

Good light air & calm finished stowing
oil & water last night & today Lat 26° S 153° 31'
Wednesday Mar 30th

Good light air & calm with some rain P.M. &
later light air Lat 14° N Long 157° 28'

Thursday March 31st

Good light breeze N.E. on the wind N.W. from
7 or 8 p.m. later about the same Lat 14° N 156° 29'

Friday April 1st

Good light breeze E. N.E. & later as before Lat 14° 156° 20'

Saturday April 2nd

Good light breeze E.N.E. bound for Guam
later heavy squalls with rain double reefed tops

Sunday Apr. 3rd

First part fresh gale & squally N.E. wind made
roundabout Lat. later about the same 155° 34'

Monday April 4th

Light part light breeze E.N.E. & squally with rain
later much the same Lat 5° 21' N 155° 30'

Tuesday April 5th

Good light breeze E.N.E. & squally on the wind
later much the same Lat 15° Long 155° 38'

Wednesday April 6th

Good light breeze N.E. employed in setting up the
water quibing sails &c. later squally made
about 155° 30'

Lat 7° 26' Long 155° 30'

Thursday April 7th

First part squally P.M. passed the Sals as a ship
to be supposed then to be on the reef 11 P.M. with
wind calm later backed for her found her nearly high
& lay on the reef Lat 7° 44' Long 155° 40'

Old Boat again started

Bark Fortune in the Pacific Ocean
Friday April 8th 1842

Good light breeze & squally got within 12 miles of the
ship found she was on the weather side of the reef
her mast & sail standing. Night & day weather
overtaking us we kept on our course for Guam
Rain & later much the same Lat 8° 53' Long 155° 30'

Saturday April 9th

Good light breeze & squally with rain setting up
water. Back menning sails &c. M.A. & later as before

Sunday April 10th

Good fresh gale N.E. and squally later pleasant
bound to Guam Lat 12° 10' Long 153° 29'

Monday April 11th

Good fresh gale N.E. could not N.W. M.A. & later
about the same Lat 13° 1 Long 151° 29'

Tuesday April 12th

Good fresh gale E.N.E. courses P.M. finished quilt-
ing (the tops & lower) M.A. & later as before Lat 13° 26' Long 149° 7'

Wednesday April 13th

Good fresh gale E.N.E. took in the broken anchor
straightened, washed on the keel & put it out again
M.A. & later about the same Lat 13° 50' Long 147° 30'

Thursday April 14th

Good fresh gale E. later part made Guam bound
M.A. & later as before Lat 13° 44' Long 145° 9'

Friday April 15th

Good light breeze E. 5 P.M. went on shore to see
the Governor later came to anchor at the anchorage
where the Emerald left for the harbour

Saturday April 16th

Good light breeze employed in getting water ashore
M.A. & later as before Lat 13° 40' Long 143° 40'

Sunday April 17th

Good light breeze employed in getting water ashore
M.A. & later as before Lat 13° 40' Long 143° 40'
