First part moderate breeze from South and cloudy hazy weather heading to Eastward at 4 P.M. wind hands to SE we tack Ship Middle and latter winds baffling, see S.W. by S and squalls closing up the light sails in squalls and setting again after at 11 P.M. carried away and the boatstays kept the Ship before the wind and fithat it again P. School latter Oct 22:18 Long by Oct 36:54

Throughout these 24 hours strong gales from ESE to E and chafed the S. by at times breaking down S. of Seal & by 7 1/2 at 5 PM took a N.E. gullant sail & double reefed fore top sail, midnight made sail at 7 AM raised a ketch run for it saw no more of it left off course and set fore top mast & low studding sail at 5 PM a brig passed us she is white. 30 guns along swell bearing from South East by 1/2 S. 30° 57' South Long 4, 40° 48' 1/2 West.

Saw 3 at 4 PM it cleared off wind hauled to westward we hoisted standing sails & heaved up the yards and then S.W. it blowed up strong at 7 PM took in light sails at 10 double reefed top sails midnight hauled jib & main sail at 12 AM took in fore top sail & closed reefed main one took up in bowsprit & main spruce and heaved ship to wind shifted into S.W. latter heavy gales and clear weather lying to heading up S.E. to S.W. Chas watch employed in making scrubbooms
