Remarks on Saturday Sept 21st

These 24 hours strong from S.W. and cloudy weather with passing squalls carrying all possible sail at 7 P.M. took in top m. Hudding sail at 8 AM wind shifted to S.W. So Ends Lat by Obs 48° 30'

Remarks on Sunday Sept 22nd

First part moderate breezes from S.W. and dark cloudy weather. At 8 P.M. wind shifted to S.E. Middle part heavy gales and raining at 9 P.M. took in top m. sails double reefed top sail mid night put in top sail Daylight gale abated some set the top sails & 3/4 sails 4 P.M. saw ship off to Eastward So Ends Lat by act 48° 5'

Remarks on Monday Sept 23rd

These 24 hours strong from Westward and cloudy misty weather. At 8 P.M. carrying all possible sail at 7 P.M. took in top mast standing sail at 6 AM set it again Lat by Obs 46° 41' Long by Obs 178° 12' West

Remarks on Tuesday Sept 24th

All these 24 hours fresh breezes from West and fine weather. At 8 P.M. with all sail out watch employed in Ships duty. So Ends Lat by Obs 45° 59' N

Remarks on Wednesday Sept 25th

First and middle part fresh breezes from Westward. At 9 AM wind shifted to S.E. we steamed by the wind, saw several Fin Backs So Ends Lat 45° 58'

Remarks on Thursday Sept 26th

All these 24 hours strong breezes from S.E. and clear weather. At 8 P.M. by the wind on the tack with all sail set saw several Fin Backs Lat by Obs 45° 53' Long by Obs 168° 57' West

Remarks on Friday Sept 27th

This Day fresh breezes from S.E. by the wind heading East & with all drawing sail. Middle and latter raining. So Ends Lat by act 45° 34'

Remarks on Saturday Sept 28th

Long with moderate breezes from S.E. and Drizzly weather. At 8 AM with all sail set to best advantage. Mid night shifted to North and cleared off latter part. So Ends Lat by act 46° 20' Long 175° 9' West

Remarks on Sunday Sept 29th

These 24 hours baffling wind and cloudy weather. At 8 AM with all sail out, I am some better. So Ends Lat by Obs 45° 31'

Remarks on Monday Sept 30th

Long by act 175° 40' West

Bound into Port A.D. 1851

Remarks on Monday Sept 29th

Throughout these 24 hours fresh breezes from West to S.W. and cloudy weather. At 8 P.M. with all sail set So Ends nothing in sight. John the Kanakica sick below. I have got better. So as to be about Deck Lat by Obs 45° 19' South

Remarks on Tuesday Sept 30th

These 24 hours baffling from S.W. to West. At 8 AM East middle part strong breezes we took in light sails at 6 AM and made all sail watch employed in Ships duty. Saw several Fin Backs. So Ends invalids no better Lat by Obs 42° 40' North

Remarks on Wednesday Oct 1st

This Day fresh gales from W.S.W. and clear weather. At 8 AM with all sail set, saw some Fin Backs watch employed in washing off the Ship. So Ends Lat by Obs 40° 55' Long by Obs 166° 15' West

Remarks on Thursday Oct 2nd

All this Day fresh gales from W.S.W. and clear weather. At 8 AM at 6 P.M. took in top mast standing sail. At 4 PM the watch employed in washing ship off. So Ends John has got better Lat by Obs 38° 17' South

Remarks on Friday Oct 3rd

Fresh gales from S.W. and passing squalls. At 8 P.M. by S.E. compass at 5 AM took in top gallant sails & double reefed fore top sail. So Ends Lat by Obs 35° 58'

Remarks on Saturday Oct 4th

Born with fresh gales from S.W. and squally weather. At 8 P.M. I under hool top sails at 3 P.M. wind shifted to North in a squall. Middle and latter fresh gales and clear. At 8 P.M. latter made all sail. So Ends watch employed in scrubbing & washing Ship out side Lat 33° 25' Long by Obs 152° 11'

Remarks on Sunday Oct 5th

Fresh gales from S.W. and clear weather. At 8 P.M. with all sail set. About the Kanakica below sick. So Ends Lat by Obs 30° 48'

Remarks on Monday Oct 6th

Strong winds from Eastward and hazy weather. At 8 P.M. with all sail out at 8 P.M. took in top m. Daylight set it. Watch employed in Ships duty. So Ends most very sick Lat by Obs 28° 17'

Remarks on Tuesday Oct 7th

Long by Obs 152° 8' West
